 - Snow Days: Lessons Learned Presentation

 - Superintendent Ghysels reviewed the Snow Days: Lessons Learned Presentation that was presented to the Board of Trustees the night prior with the committee
 - A survey will come out in May to gather information from the community to gather input. The committee asked to include a question asking, “If your student rides the bus, on snow days, would you be able to take them to school?” and “Would you be able to drop your child at an alternate bus stop?”
 - The committee also asked if other alternatives are being considered besides adjusting the school calendar. What can the district do to lessen the number of snow days being called?
 - Superintendent Ghysels and Amber shared that we have a meeting set with Placer County Supervisor Gustafson to discuss continuing to prioritize bus routes when plowing streets. TTUSD also expressed they are open to exploring alternate bus stops for snowy days when roads are unplowed.
 - Staff also let the committee know that 2-Hour Delayed Start days are still very much an option. Unfortunately, in the 22/23 winter, any time they were considered, we were told by partner agencies that 2-hours would not make a significant difference in their plowing.
- Parent Roundtable - School Updates
 - DTE: The Nelson Nordic Challenge was coming up that weekend. And, the DTE community is excited about Amy King moving into the principal role next year.

- ACMS: They just had a successful field trip to Sierra College. It was great to see these events back in full swing after COVID.
