What is the SELPA and the CAC?

SELPA stands for "Special Education Local Plan Area." SELPA is responsible for insuring that all services are provided as required by the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA), the federal law for special education. The SELPA is responsible for facilitation and interpretation of all legal requirements. It provides information and resources to families of children with disabilities so they can fully understand their rights. All of the local education agencies (LEAs) and the county office of education in Placer County are members of the Placer County SELPA.

The Community Advisory Committee (CAC) is one of the stakeholder groups that meets regularly with SELPA staff. Representatives from each LEA are nominated and approved by their respective governing boards to serve on the CAC. Most CAC representatives are parents of special education students, which give them the unique viewpoint, emotions, and similar circumstances that other parents of students with special needs may experience. In addition, representatives of other agencies working to support students with special needs also participate in the CAC. CAC members volunteer their time.



One of the roles of the CAC is to advise the SELPA and encourage community awareness and involvement when changes and updates to the local plan are made, or to address the annual priorities of the plan. In addition, CAC members participate in the following responsibilities and activities:
