In the 2nd Grade Classroom


The 2nd Grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:


 Teachers will send home a monthly reading log to document reading at home.

 Teachers will send home fact fluency level to practice at home.

At Home

LCES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success.


 Parents will read with their child for 20 minutes every night and log reading on monthly reading log.


 Parents will make flashcards or play addition and subtraction fluency games with their child.



2nd Grade Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:

 Students will read 20 minutes at home every night.

 Students will practice math fluency facts at home.
