This is the group that at Kindergarten was instructed at home via zoom meetings for Covid reasons. Positively, a strength of this group of students is mathematics. Intervention math kits were purchased to help all classes increase small group instruction within the math curriculum. Staff will look at and analyze data by grade level.
