Frenchtown Rural Fire District (FRFD) is reaching out to select high schools across the country to inform them of the FRFD Resident Firefighter Program.

Our program, located in Frenchtown, Montana, offers highly motivated high school graduates an exciting opportunity to begin an emergency services career while serving alongside FRFD's Career and Volunteer Firefighters.

Accepted candidates will participate in a three-year program designed to professionally prepare them for success in the hiring process of a highly competitive career field.

During the first year, program participants will be trained and certified in structure & wildland firefighting, licensed as a practicing Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and begin certifying in several technical rescue courses.

During the second and third years, program participants will participate in a higher education program. This program will provide an opportunity to earn additional certifications and/or licensure up to an Associate of Science Degree in Fire and Emergency Services. Degree accreditation is provided through our partnership with Helena College and the Montana Fire Service Training School, Montana State University. All accredited training courses are taught within FRFD facilities or online in accordance with state and nationally recognized standards.

Upon successful completion of the program, graduates will be qualified to pursue a career in emergency services throughout the country. Graduates will discover the training and experience they receive as a resident will put them ahead of the competition. Many of our former residents have transitioned to fulfilling careers and credit their success to our program.

Resident Firefighters live rent-free in one of our active fire stations. Each resident has their own room and shares a common bathroom, kitchen, and day room with career firefighters and other residents. Resident shifts are on a rotating basis and are designed to allow program participants the ability to work full or part-time and allow for adequate study time. The entire program is provided free of charge (100% tuition reimbursement) in exchange for a three-year commitment along with successful program and degree completion.

Frenchtown Rural Fire District is a combination department consisting of volunteer, career and support personnel who work closely together to provide professional emergency response services to the communities of Frenchtown, Alberton, Huson, Evaro and Missoula, Montana.





Located in western Montana, the district is an all-hazard response department with a wide variety of terrain, weather and infrastructure. Notable are over 30 miles of Interstate 90, hundreds of miles of state, rural and residential roadways. Crossing the district is heavy use rail line that sees daily transportation of all types of cargo, including industrial and commercial product transportation, lumber, coal, oil, processed fuels and chemicals, and countless consumer goods. Outdoor recreation is abundant with access to hiking, fishing, hunting, cycling and climbing among the many activi-

ties and backcountry adventures available to the outdoor enthusiast. The recreational use of the nationally known Clark Fork River and Alberton Gorge provide challenging adventures in and on the water. Our close proximity to the Missoula International Airport along with the varied industrial and commercial ventures throughout the area require close cooperation and training with our neighboring agencies. The majority of the district's residents live in close proximity to or within a beautiful and expansive wildland urban interface surrounded by National Forests and State Lands that provide secluded rural living with quick access to the nearby city of Missoula. The Frenchtown area is centrally located between Glacier and Yellowstone National Parks, and just a short driving distance from the Bob Marshal and Selway Bitterroot Wilderness areas and the Lolo and Stevensville National Forests. There is something for everyone within the Frenchtown Missoula valley area!



VOLUNTEER

Traditional Volunteers live within the district and serve their community through 911 response, continuous training, event participation and administrative support.

Non-traditional Volunteers live outside of the district and serve in the same manner as our Traditional Volunteers in exchange for certifications, experience, and agency affiliation.



RESIDENT VOLUNTEER

Resident Volunteers live within the district's stations and adhere to a set shift and training schedule while taking part in a focused training and education program designed to assist in preparation for a successful career in emergency services.



CAREER

Local 4654 Career Firefighters are full-time employees of the district providing professional structure, wildland, rescue and emergency medical response. In addition, the career firefighters assist with administrative duties, including but not limited to; public education, fire prevention, member training, career development, and preventative health services.

In cooperation with Helena College, located in Helena Montana, program participants will earn an Associate of Science Degree in Fire and Emergency Services.

Upon successful completion of the three-year program, graduates will be qualified to successfully pursue a career in emergency services. Many of our former Residents have transitioned to fulfilling careers and credit their success to our program.

The entire program is provided free of charge with 100% of the college tuition reimbursed upon successful program and degree completion in exchange for a three-year commitment to Frenchtown Rural Fire District that runs concurrently with program participation.



Associate of Science (A.S.) Fire and Emergency Services

The Helena College Fire and Emergency Services program is designed to prepare graduates for entry into the challenging and competitive field of fire and emergency services. The program concentrates on industry recognized certifications and the U.S. Fire Administration's Federal Fire and Emergency Services Higher Education Curriculum, while also providing the student with a well-rounded general education and 4-year degree transfer opportunities. Successful students will be well-trained and qualified to enter and advance in careers with fire and emergency services agencies across Montana and around the country.

Upon successful completion of the A.S. program, a student will be able to:

- Demonstrate professional conduct by displaying a positive work ethic, flexibility, teamwork, physical fitness, safety consciousness, and sensitivity to diversity.
- Demonstrate basic fire fighter skills in the areas of structural firefighting, wildland firefighting, hazardous materials, and emergency response.
- Effectively communicate and interact in the workplace as well as in the community.
- Be able to function at the NFPA 1001 Fire Fighter I Level
- Demonstrate basic knowledge of fire protection systems, fire prevention, and technical rescue techniques.
- Be able to function at the NFPA 1001 Fire Fighter II Level

The cooperation between Helena College and Frenchtown Rural Fire District offers students the opportunity to earn an Associate of Science in Fire and Emergency Services while living and working in a fire station as a resident volunteer.
