### ADVANCEMENT TO HIGHER-LEVEL CLASSES WITH GOOD PERFORMANCE.

The Freshman Foundations Program is not a "forever" program. After freshman year, a student can advance to higher-level classes based on his or her performance and teacher recommendations. Or, he or she can also continue to learn in adapted level classes.

Freshman Foundations students benefit from our Success Program, where scheduled support classes offer assistance for any level of classes students are enrolled in. It is not uncommon for Freshman Foundations students to elevate to more advanced classes once the foundations for effective learning are established in their freshman year, while still benefiting from a supported environment through the Center For Success.

In addition, all athletic teams, academic clubs, extracurricular activities and leadership programs are available to Freshman Foundations students.

The Freshman Foundations Program is one of the six learning levels at Union Catholic, and participants have the same teachers, classrooms and schedules as students in other levels.
