NEW PRESIDENT

On Monday, May 15, 2023, the Diocese of Pittsburgh announced the appointment of **Mrs. Kelly Lazzara** as the third President of the school and Oakland Catholic High School excitedly welcomed her to campus! After a successful national search conducted by Partners in Mission and careful vetting of all candidates by the Search Committee, **Bishop David Zubik** appointed Mrs. Lazzara at the recommendation of the Search Committee. She officially took office on July 1.

Mrs. Lazzara brings extensive experience in school administration, teaching, development, and marketing to her new role, including previous experience in the Diocese of Pittsburgh and the Diocese of Greensburg. Most recently, Lazzara served as the Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Richmond. Prior to her career in education, she held several different positions in the sales and marketing industry.

In his appointment letter to Lazzara, Bishop Zubik emphasized the mission of diocesan schools, writing, "Our Catholic school administrators are witnesses, in word and deed, to the Divine Teacher, Jesus Christ and share a commitment to the fostering of the Catholic mission and identity of each school. I know that you, likewise, understand the importance of forming young women in the faith and guiding them to excel in service and leadership. May the Lord, in His goodness, continue to bless you as you begin this new role."

The appointment is the result of a search which began last November when outgoing president Mary Claire Kasunic announced her decision to step down from the position after serving Oakland Catholic High School for over 30 years, with the last nine years as the school's second President. Pleased to know that the school is in such competence hands, Mrs. Kasunic is "grateful to have worked with so many talented educators over the years, so many dedicated individuals, so many inspiring colleagues, and so many leaders and mentors along the way." As she put it, "I am excited to start a new adventure, but sad to leave Oakland Catholic—this institution which has been my home, my anchor, my favorite project, and the source of so much inspiration, learning, and motivation in my life for so very long."

President Lazzara is thrilled to be back in Western Pennsylvania and looks forward to advancing the school, its mission, and its legacy of excellence for years to come. She shares, "I am truly honored and humbled to be appointed the new President of Oakland Catholic High School. My primary goal will be to foster the strong tradition of educating young women in spirituality, scholarship, and service. I look forward to meeting everyone and fully immersing myself in the OC community. Go Eagles!"

Our Oakland Catholic High School students have already started ruminating on this challenge. The quest for why is one that evolves over a lifetime—in fact, it may even be seen as an art.

Exposure to experiences including travel, service, faith formation, literature, music, and art all add to what drives each person to their why. Oakland Catholic High School offers opportunities through a variety of facets that allow students to press forward in their search. Starting in freshman year, our OC Eagles engage in a well-rounded curriculum including their initial opportunity to express themselves as high school artists.

Mrs. Megan Koroly, Oakland Catholic's Art teacher and Fine Arts Department Chair, has presented her students with the important and ever challenging question—"what is your why?" Mrs. Koroly has been teaching art for over 30 years and has been a part of the OC family for the last eight years.

Meg Koroly is a self-proclaimed lifelong learner.

She graduated from Carlow University, continued to take graduate classes at Youngstown State, spent a summer at Burren College of Art in Ireland, and is currently taking classes on Catholic Sacred Art. Her love of art has allowed OC's art program to grow with her! She has brought many art initiatives to Oakland Catholic, including summer programs, a pottery studio with eight potter's wheels, and a strong and growing College Board Advanced Placement (AP) Program.

"Our why is always changing, but there is an inner "why" that stays the same and keeps you motivated to keep moving, to keep working on your goals every day. Those small bits of hope make us continue to get up the next day and work at finding our 'why."

Taking AP Art, and completing a portfolio, has become the capstone of the art program. The AP Art course allows student artists to focus on, and pursue, a topic of interest throughout an entire school year. The process begins with an inquiry question which must be answered visually.

While brainstorming strong inquiry questions, Mrs. Koroly encourages her artists to think about their why. She explains, "[...] if they feel a strong connection with their subject, the artwork will be more authentic and meaningful." Students are prompted to consider what topics are important, why they are choosing specific materials, and what others know about the topic. Ultimately, the process is comparable to inviting others into the artist's studio for a year.


As OC student artists move through the AP Art course, they document the creative process including research, sketchbook work, and finished pieces of art.

This course is unlike other art class offerings, as students are not given specific projects or prompts to complete. Instead of following a typical class structure, each student works on her own pieces which include a body of work guided by her self-selected inquiry question.

> Koroly enthusiastically shares, "This allows for so much opportunity for creative thinking and problem-solving. It is a wonderful opportunity for self-expression through art. I have had students explore everything from cartooning to digital art, to traditional oil painting, and each has found her voice and why. This extensive work challenges our OC artists to continually seek their purpose and why, as they also work through additional course work in science, humanities, and other areas of interest.

Along with traditional course work, students are invited to explore outside of their classroom walls. Mrs. Koroly took her entire AP Art class to visit the Carnegie International. Koroly shares the experience, detailing, of the artwork we saw, and they were inspired by the stories of the artists featured in the exhibit." Through experiential learning, the student artists were able to

A lot of things are interconnected. Nothing exists on its own—STEM, Art, Humanities do not exist in a vacuum on their own. Rather, we need people of different backgrounds to come together to create. For us to accomplish anything great to truly make positive change, we need variety. Art isn't only reserved for people who were "born with specific talents." Art is a form of self-expression and encourages us to use our creativity—it is what makes us human.


Mrs. Koroly does just what she asks of her students. She shares, "I love continuing to learn as much as I can as a teacher and artist, and I continue to learn from my students each day."

Closely to how Mrs. Koroly encourages her students to seek their why; she does the same. She has been greatly inspired by Pope John Paul II and his Letter to Artists. He writes, "Beauty is the vocation bestowed on the artist in the gift of artistic talent." Mrs. Koroly has found her why in, "[...] seeking truth, beauty, and goodness in all I do." She continues, "I believe that beauty is a universal need for humans. My faith truly guides me as an artist."

The Golden Apple Award winning teacher has used her why to inspire so many around her.

"[She] encourages students to find beauty in all they do, and to even find beauty in the struggles of daily life. A great work of art does not necessarily have to be a beautiful subject but can be made beautiful by the artist."

Pope John Paul II wrote, in his Letter to Artists, "None can sense more deeply than you artists, ingenious creators of beauty that you are, something of the pathos with which God at the dawn of creation looked upon the work of his hands." Mrs. Koroly uses her art, and why, to encourage those around her to do the same. Through self-exploration, in and outside the doors of Oakland Catholic High School, we know all OC Eagles leave equipped to leaning into the art of finding their unique and ever evolving why.

FIELD TRIP HIGHLIGHTS

Do you remember that magical excitement of embarking on your class field trip? The joy of being out of the classroom and learning from a different perspective with your peers? Whether a kindergartener going to the zoo or a senior in high school visiting a manufacturing facility, field trips allow you to experience instruction in a hands-on approach outside the classroom. Oakland Catholic students had various opportunities over the past six months to explore learning outside the classroom and practice critical thinking skills.

Braskem, a world-renowned plastics manufacturer, invited OC students to tour their facility and to hear from various women about their careers in STEM. Students engaged with chemists, chemical engineers, researchers, and a leader of product stewardship. After touring Braskem's facility and learning about the machines used to produce and test plastics, students applied their newfound skills to make solar powered phone chargers to donate to those without electricity. School Counselor Sami Conley stated "Our field trip to Braskem was an exciting and engaging way to introduce our students to the world of chemical engineering. It is so important for our students to hear firsthand, that even in a historically male dominated field, there are incredible women in every different stage of plastics production, from research and development to developing the formula of chemicals used." Lauren Gallo OCHS'25 couldn't agree more. "I liked the tour and the hands-on activity where we got to make a light powered charger...Personally, I find field trips very fun, and they educate us as well."

Four OC students attended the **Thomas Kline School of Law's "Future Voices of the People"** at Duquesne University to discuss future careers in law. They participated in mock classes, group discussions, and toured the Kline classrooms and the campus. The girls had the privilege of meeting retired Pennsylvania Supreme Court Justice Cynthia Baldwin. **Kammy Kemmer**, College Counselor, commented "I think the girls were inspired to think about the changes that they could make, realizing that change happens with hard work and preparation. From the classroom to the courtroom, these young ladies have a bright future at their fingertips."

Oakland Catholic's location is in the heart of Pittsburgh's academic, cultural, and healing center. This provides our students unique opportunities for walking field trips. At the beginning of March, Mrs. Koroly's AP Art and Design class made their way down Forbes Avenue to the Carnegie Museum of Art. While there, they explored the Carnegie International exhibit through the trained eyes of two artists that accompanied them.

Taking advantage of our location in Oakland, Spanish classes took walking field trips to **The Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh**, **The Carnegie Museums**, **The Latin American Cultural Center**, and local restaurants serving Latin American cuisine. At the library, the students explored Spanish-language literature and (re)acquainted themselves with the space, resources, and events dedicated for teens.

In April, the AP and CE French classes visited the **Frick Museum**, where they enjoyed guided, interactive tours of **Clayton**, the historic Frick family home. They also explored the **Frick Art Museum** where they viewed Helen Frick's collection of French art and furniture.

Marigrace and Aibreann did their best to stay warm at the March St. Patrick's Day parade and festivities!







I learned a tremendous amount in my years at Oakland Catholic! Attending an all-girls school had a huge impact on me; it helped build confidence and played a significant role in motivating my current research into women in politics. Some of my favorite OC memories are reading *Jane Eyre* in Mrs. Stack's class, participating in Masque (especially the production of *42nd Street*), and Forensics competitions, going to Lulu's Noodles after class, and making incredible friends like Jackie Walker, who I still get together with whenever I am in town.

I am currently an Assistant Professor in the Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto. I received my PhD from Georgetown University in 2019 and specialize in international security, the domestic politics of foreign policy, and gender and international relations. This year, I was appointed as a non-resident senior fellow in the Reimaging Grand Strategy Program at the Stimson Center, a prominent Washington, D.C. think-tank, published my first solo-authored peer-reviewed article in a major journal, taught more than 375 undergraduate and graduate students, and was cited as a source in a *New York Times* retrospective on the Iraq War. I have always loved research, and the opportunity to work with undergraduates first coming to the discipline and graduate students starting their own careers as scholars and practitioners in academia is extremely rewarding. My parents really influenced my career trajectory—I was fortunate to grow up in a loving and supportive environment, with folks that always encouraged me to be intellectually curious. Students at OC have so many fabulous opportunities. I would encourage students to follow their passions and try new things. Participating in Masque and Forensics competitions helped me prepare for teaching large lectures and giving research presentations. This is absolutely something that is learned at OC: knowledge is power.
