Minutes approved: September meeting notes: Dr. Lori Hawthorne approved, Tracey Meade 2nd.

Student Body Officer Report: They hit their goal of \$4,000 and raised almost \$6,000. These funds will go towards the teen center and allows the students to have another dance. The dance will be on December 2nd and be called “Snow Ball”. This will be for Davis students only and everyone will be encouraged to attend. Preparations are going forward for the silent auction that will run between November 10-18. Deadline for the baskets/donations will be November 5th. Sub for Santa goal this year is \$50,000. The highest Sub for Santa total achieved is \$37,000. The Officers are reaching out to feeder schools for support with their fundraising in hopes they can have donations help the teen center.

Officer Mike Criddle: Everything seems to be going good.

PTSA Update: The Student of the Month breakfast was held and was a success. Reflections are going forward and encouraging participants. Parent Teacher Conference will be on November 13th.

Kaysville City/School Communication: Chief Ellington from the city will be interested in collaborating with the school and community council. UDOT is considering putting a bike lane from Cherry Hill to 200 North. This could be problematic because it would eliminate main street parking in front of the high school. Kaysville main street is a state road.

LAND Trust Goals: Reviewed last year allocations and expenditures.

Safe Technology & Digital Responsibility: Scott Waters (school technology specialist) discussed the different filtering systems the school is using to help protect students. IBOSS does not include snapchat and Instagram. Net Support allows you to take over student's screens. Net Ref takes pictures and captures history. There are protections when students are using the devices the school is giving students. Student's searches are always being monitored for key words that include: bomb, suicide, kill, etc. These are immediately red flagged. The biggest threats being seen are pornographic material, gaming and social media bullying.

Digital Citizenship: Dr. Hawthorne suggested as a council if we have any suggestions or recommendations to help increase the digital citizenship awareness for the school. Sessions were offered last year as well as information in the newsletter.

Council items: Question raised about when students are marked tardy verses absent verses if students get marked late at all with varying teachers. A second question related to when Community Council elections are held. Traditionally, Davis High School has held elections in the spring for the upcoming school year. The question /concern was to ensure communication and opportunities for upcoming parents are being included for 9th grade parents. The council will discuss next meeting whether to change the election to fall of the new school year or keep the same, holding it in the spring.
