TOTAL PROPOSED 2022-23 BUDGET \$86,634,308



- Expands social emotional support, with the addition of an elementary school counselor and social worker.
- Includes \$15,430,667 million in Cessation Funds to help offset tax increases due to Indian Point's closure
- 3.2% tax levy increase, well below the state tax cap of 15.2%

TRANSPORTATION UPGRADES

- Includes two 72-passenger transit-style buses, two 18-passenger single-wheel vans, one with wheelchair lift; and one multi-purpose vehicle.
- Not to exceed \$500,000

HENDRICK HUDSON FREE LIBRARY BUDGET

Voters may also vote on the Hendrick Hudson Free Library budget – not affiliated with the school district.


Absentee Ballots

WHAT DOES THE PROPOSED 2022-23 BUDGET ACCOMPLISH?


- Maintains all current academic & extracurricular programming for students.

Proposed Budget Expenditures Total Budget: \$86,634,308





PROGRAM COMPONENT

Funding for instructional programs and educational support services for district students.



CAPITAL COMPONENT

Funding for school and property maintenance; utilities; debt service.



ADMINISTRATIVE COMPONENT

Funding for the leadership and supervision of school and district programs and services, as well as District Office operations.

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CONTINGENT BUDGET

Under state law, school boards can submit a budget to voters a maximum of two times. If the proposed budget is defeated twice, the board must adopt a contingent budget. A school board also has the option of going directly to a contingent budget after the first budget defeat. Under a contingent budget, the district must adopt a budget with the same tax levy as the prior year. For Hendrick Hudson, this would require a \$1,571,157 million reduction to the proposed budget.
