

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF WATERFORD TOWNSHIP  
SCHOOL DISTRICT  
SUPPORTING THE WATERFORD TOWNSHIP  
SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROJECT AND THE APPLICATION FOR SAFE ROUTES TO  
SCHOOL FUNDING TO MAKE INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS  
THAT WILL IMPROVE THE BIKING ENVIRONMENT FOR STUDENTS

WHEREAS, it is our understanding that Waterford Township proposes the installation of a designated multi-use path markings, signage, and facilities along Camilla Avenue, West Atlantic Avenue, Atco Avenue, 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Raritan Avenue, and Lincoln Avenue to connect students in the area to Atco Elementary School and Thomas Richards School.

WHERE AS, this project serves students and guardians on the route to the school; and

WHEREAS, this Safe Routes to School Project will provide a much-needed safety improvement in the area and will clearly provide a much safer transportation experience for students and the general population of Waterford Township and

WHEREAS, the project will make the route to two (2) of the District's schools and recreation facilities, much safer; and

WHEREAS, it is our belief that the proposed activities are consistent with the goals of the Safe Routes to Schools program and the policies of the Waterford Township School District, and that funding this project would provide a significant opportunity for the Township of Waterford to improve student safety in the Township of Waterford.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF WATERFORD TOWNSHIP SCHOOL DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

The Waterford Township School District fully supports the Township of Waterford's efforts in seeking New Jersey Department of Transportation Safe Routes to Schools funds and will collaborate to support the goals of the project, namely, to improve safety, encourage biking to school, and to improve the biking environment for students of the district and other users of the routes.
