

TIPS for Students and Families

Response to Fentanyl Crisis – School Preparedness

• In recent weeks the news has been filled with stories about the increase in fentanyl related deaths in Colorado, including school age children.



- In Feb 2022, D11 updated policy JLCE, First Aid and Emergency Medical Care, to include training for appropriate school staff in the emergency use of an opioid antagonist (also known as naloxone hydrochloride or NARCAN) and procedures for the District to maintain a supply of NARCAN for District and school use.
- Appropriate staff at each individual school should be made aware of the availability and location of NARCAN at their sites. 
- Review/discuss school approach to Response to Intervention (RTI)/ Multi-tier Support System (MTSS) and SEL successes/challenges;
- Differentiation, blended learning, tutoring, interventions, etc.
- Instructional supports for RTI/MTSS Tier 2 and Tier 3 students including support to Gifted & Talented (GT) and English Language Learner (ELL) students
- Review/discuss school's focus on parent strategies for individual student support (i.e. parent and teacher as partners in student learning, with focus on student technology device use, parent support with new K-8 math curriculum and support for closing COVID related gaps from 21-22)
- Review available progress monitoring data results and compare against "One Plan"/USIP goals
