### Welcome

The District 11 DAC and it's subcommittees continue to work diligently and deliberately as we reach the halfway point of the 2019-20 academic year. We are proud as a DAC that every school in District 11 has a School Accountability Committee (SAC). We look forward in continuing to support all SACs. We are also looking forward to supporting our Board of Education (BOE) and its new members. Here are a few highlights on what was accomplished in the month of November.

- The DAC had an important look at the Budget Equity Exercise that will be happening at each school in the January to March timeframe. SACs will be an important part of this exercise. Principals are being trained to have this valuable conversation that incorporates school communities. This exercise is in support of the strategic plan strategy that states, "In pursuit of our mission and mission impacts: we will guarantee an ecosystem of equitable practices to meet the unique needs of all".
- The Training and SAC Support Subcommittee hosted the 2nd SAC Training Session on November 7th, 2019. About 80 SAC members and administration representatives from about 30 D11 schools participated. We had two engaging speakers. Dr. Michael Thomas focused on highlights of how the strategic plan is helping to form the Academic Master Plan. SACs are going to have more involvement for input at the school level. Next, as part of the Family Learning Institute, national motivational speaker, Jeff Veley, discussed resilience education for bullying prevention. The 3rd SAC Training Session is scheduled for February 6, 2020.
- The DAC Budget Subcommittee started the process of reviewing the 2019-20 midyear budget modification requests. The subcommittee will continue this process in December and provide a comprehensive recommendation to the BOE. The Subcommittee also continued looking at AVID and the Gifted and Talented programs. The findings and recommendations for these programs will be forwarded to the BOE after mid-year budget modifications are completed.
  - The DAC Accreditation Subcommittee looked at the READ Act Data from the District with Ms. Christy Feldman. The subcommittee said goodbye to Dr. Ed Plute, as he is retiring and moving out of town. His experience and leadership have been invaluable. Jane Tucker will take over heading this subcommittee.

#### SAC Agenda Planning – December/January (Theme: Catch-up and Safe Learning Environment)

Every month we intend to provide a reasonable flow of SAC agenda topics that meet the broad responsibilities of School District 11 SACs. This is just a reference tool and individual SACs should tailor agendas appropriate to their school needs and emphasis. The following are some of the agenda topics that are recommended for the December and/or January SAC meetings:

- Review/discuss topics from the D11 SAC Handbook, Agenda Planning Guide for previous months which have not yet been addressed.
- Review/discuss safe learning environment for the school (safety, discipline, attendance, etc.).
  Your principal has current discipline and attendance statistics, broken down by poverty and ethnicity subcategories, for the entire school in summary format which should be shared periodically with the SAC to discuss trends. What is the chronic absenteeism rate for your school? Has it been improving in the second quarter? [Note: For MS and HS SACs, this data should be available from the D11 Early Warning System data package.]
- Review/discuss the school's focus on parent strategies for individual student support as well as teacher/parent communication. Are most parents/guardians using the student information system Q and/or the new D-11 mobile app to monitor daily student assignments and progress? Is school administrative staff working to update parent/guardian contact information for errors noted on communications rejection reports? Are teachers using the teacher messaging system in Blackboard to communicate with parents?
- Review/discuss school budget alignment with USIP goals and identify school funding shortfalls, e.g.;
  - Instructional resources to meet transition to new state standards
  - Technology resources needed for student learning/testing

Note: Budget/funding recommendations must be submitted to DAC by Feb 1, 2020 to be considered for the school year 20-21 budget.

Review results of Galileo K-12 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter ADB tests (grades 2-8) and compare to USIP targets. Is your school meeting or exceeding its student growth targets? What strategies is the school using to assist students who are struggling the most, and are they working?

### Mitchell High School

- Forty Mitchell HS students received free laptop computers Monday, December 9th thanks to the Pikes Peak United Way program, Colorado Springs Promise. Colorado Springs Promise is expanding to include four other schools in District 11. Qualifying students from Doherty High School, Palmer High School and the Roy J. Wasson Academic Campus will be receiving laptops before the winter break starts. Thanks to an anonymous \$25,000 grant from a Wasson High School alumni the program has been able to grow. Students are nominated by their teachers to receive these laptops to fill a void at home when students are struggling to keep up with homework. Over the past three years, 300 computers have been distributed solely to Mitchell High School students. Mitchell High School's graduation rate has increased by four percentage points since Colorado Springs Promise started providing the lap top computers in 2016.
- Mitchell HS has partnered with Peak Vista to establish a new primary health care facility within Mitchell High school. This new facility will offer medical, dental and behavioral health services. The health center is approximately 4,850 square-feet of renovated space in the northwest portion of Mitchell HS. This facility will be a community-based health center and it is a first of its kind to serve the students, staff and families of Mitchell High School and their feeder schools. The clinic will also serve neighborhood residents of all ages. Construction crews have been diligently working to



get everything finished. At this point, they hope to have the grand opening day on Monday, January 6, 2020.

### **Penrose Elementary School**

Penrose ES Kindergarten Project Based Learning (PBL) will be participating in the Kindergarten Kindness Project. They will be collecting enough hats, socks, water and toys to share with those who need a little kindness this holiday season.
