Welcome

The DAC and its subcommittees are working diligently in fulfilling the various Board of Education approved charges. I want to thank everyone at the DAC for coordinating, organizing, and conducting regular meetings to discuss relevant topics of impact that affect our district, schools, and students.

At the October meeting, the DAC took a first look at the draft of the District Equity Policy. This important policy is a necessary step in our ability to inspire every mind. The community is being asked for input on this policy as we define where we are going as a district. Corey Notestine provided an update on Social Emotional Learning in the district and how the Mill Levy Override money is helping in schools. The DAC looks forward to hearing more from the Student Success and Wellness group later in the year.

The DAC Accreditation Subcommittee looked at the Alternate Education Campus (AEC) Accreditation Status for our schools. They also got an update on the Requests to Reconsider for three of our schools. Finally, the subcommittee had a preview of Hoonuit, the new software tool which will be replacing Alpine. Dr. Ed Plute, who has led this committee for many years, will be moving out of the area and stepping down from this leadership role. The DAC thanks him for his service to the District.

The DAC Budget Subcommittee has been charged with reviewing and updating the Board on several district academic programs. The Subcommittee met once over the past month to gather information and start to discuss the procedure and pathway to efficiently review the programs.

The SAC Training and Support Subcommittee finalized the agenda for the November 7th training session. Dr. Thomas will be speaking about the District Strategic Plan moving into the Academic Master Plan, and the role the SAC will play in that important work. Mr. Jeff Veley, a national motivational speaker, will be speaking on resilience education for bullying prevention. The DAC highly recommends multiple SAC members, school administrators, and school community attend this important educational session.

Lastly, as Veterans Day approaches the DAC wants to salute and thank all our active duty military members and veterans for their daily service and sacrifice. This newsletter contains information pertaining to Veterans Day events at various district schools. We encourage SACs, parents, and community members to support our local schools and veterans by participating in these Veterans Day events.

I have so much to be thankful for. On behalf of the DAC, I wish all of you a happy Thanks-giving! Remember to vote in the upcoming November 5th elections.



Agenda Planning—November Theme: Achievement Gaps

Every month we intend to provide a reasonable flow of SAC agenda topics that meet the broad responsibilities of School District 11 SACs. This is just a reference tool and individual SACs should tailor agendas appropriate to their school needs and emphasis. The following are some of the agenda topics that are recommended for the November SAC meeting:

- Review/discuss components of the school's 2019-2020 draft USIP which address achievement gaps. What Response to Intervention/Multi-tier Support System (MTSS) tools is the school using, e.g. differentiation, blended learning, tutoring?
- Review instructional supports for MTSS/RTI Tier 2 and Tier 3 students including support for Gifted and Talented (GT) and English Language Learner (ELL) students
- Review MTSS Early Warning System school summary data on attendance/absenteeism, discipline, and academic concerns
- Review fall test results for DIBELS Next, Achieve 3000, and/or Galileo K-12 Aligned District Benchmark October test results as appropriate/compare with draft USIP academic targets.
- Review/discuss the school's focus on parent strategies for individual student support. Are
 most parents/guardians using the student information system Q and/or the new D-11 mobile
 app to monitor daily student assignments and progress? Has the trend on use been increasing? Do teachers use these systems effectively to inform and maintain contact with parents?
