* A student's weighted GPA is computed using semester grades. Using the weighted grading system, a class rank is determined for every student by grade level. All courses are factored in the GPA except the following: Correspondence, pass/fail, jr. high, summer school, credit by exam, credit recovery courses, and dual credit. A student's College 4.0 unweighted GPA is computed using all courses that were taken for high school credit. The Spring 2020 semester was graded as Pass/Fail thus not included in the Official Ranking GPA or class rank. Student class rankings and GPAs on transcripts were calculated using the Fall 2019 semester grades.
