- Attend in-person / virtually 1-4 times a week, as decided by the teacher. It may be 1 hour before or after school Mon-Thurs with Friday Asynch.
- *Have to complete the course assigned in the 4 week period allotted, or you will have to restart the entire course, if that specific class is available (not all courses will be available each term). You cannot "roll over" your progress to the next term.*

A-G Requirements

CSU & UC ELIGIBILITY

A

History/ Social Science

2 years required

One year of world history, cultures and geography (may be a single yearlong course or two one-semester courses), and

- One year of U.S. History or one semester of U.S. history and one semester of American Government

B

English

4 years required

- College preparatory courses covering composition & literature

C

Mathematics

3 years required 4 recommended

- Minimum sequence is Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II. or Math I, Math II, Math III.
- Can start taking these courses in junior high school

D

Science

2 years required 3 recommended

- For UC take two of the three subjects: biology, chemistry, and physics
- For CSU take one year in the area of biological sciences & one year in the area of physical sciences

E

Language other than English

2 years required 3 recommended

- Take 2 years of the same foreign language.
- Can start taking these courses in junior high school

F

Visual & Performing Arts

1 years required

- Take a one year of the same class or two semesters in the same area.

G

Elective

1 years required

- Take one college prep elective. A course taken beyond the required from areas A-F will cover the requirement

A

Historia y Ciencias Sociales

2 años requeridos

Un año de historia universal, culturas y geografía (puede ser un solo curso o dos cursos de un semestre cada uno), y

- Un año de historia de los EE. UU. o un semestre de historia de los EE. UU. y otro del estudio del gobierno Estadounidense

B

Inglés

4 años requeridos

- Cursos de preparación universitaria que cubren composición y literatura

C

Matemáticas

3 años requeridos 4 años recomendados

- La secuencia mínima es Álgebra 1, Geometría, Álgebra II. o Matemáticas I, Matemáticas II, Matemáticas III.
- Puede comenzar a tomar estos cursos en la secundaria.

D

Ciencia

2 años requeridos 3 años recomendados

- Para la UC toma dos de las tres materias: biología, química y física.
- Para CSU, toma un año en el área de ciencias biológicas y un año en el área de ciencias físicas

E

Idioma Extranjero

2 años requeridos 3 años recomendados

- 2 años del mismo idioma
- Puede comenzar a tomar estos cursos en la secundaria

F

Artes Visuales y Escénicas

1 año requerido

- Un año de la misma clase o dos semestres en la misma área

G

Electivo Preparatorio

1 año requerido

- Un curso electivo preparatorio. Un curso más allá de lo requerido de las áreas A-F cumple el requisito

Senior Year Timeline



August/September

- University of California application opens on **August 1st**
- Make sure your fall and spring schedule of classes satisfy college/major admission requirements
- Start preparing for college application period by gathering all information required
- Finalize brag sheet/academic resume
- Research and apply for scholarships

October

- California State University application opens on **October 1st**
- Attend college fairs and university tours
- Find out when your local Community College applications open
- Research and apply for scholarships

November

- Deadline to apply to the UCs and CSUs is **November 30th**
- Research and apply for scholarships
- Begin gathering financial information to file for financial aid

December

- Financial Aid applications opens **December 2023, exact date TBD**
- FAFSA filers should create their FSA IDs
- Attend any Financial Aid Night and/or Cash for College event your school offers
- Continue applying to private universities through the Common Application
- Research and apply for scholarships

January/February

- Attend any financial aid night and/or Cash for College event your school offers
- Research community college orientation dates
- Research and apply for scholarships

March

- Admission decisions are released mid-March/April
- Research and apply for scholarships

April/May

- California priority deadline for the FAFSA and California Dream Act application is **April 2nd**.
- Make revisions to FAFSA/ CA Dream Act
- Review your awards letters/financial package for each campus you have been admitted
- Submit your SIR (students intent to register) before **May 1st**
- Send thank you letters for any scholarships and awards received
- Register for summer programs at your college campus
- Research registration information for your on-campus orientation

June/July

- Request and send official transcripts no later than **July 1st**
- Attend orientation and register for classes

 - Extracurricular Activities
 - Work experience

The Four Types of Financial Aid

GRANTS

FREE MONEY for educational expenses based on financial need. Don't need to pay back.

Main Types:

- Cal-Grant
- Pell-Grant
- University

WORK STUDY

Federal program that facilitates on campus part-time jobs for students who qualify. A large number of campus jobs are reserved for these students.

- Students get paid directly

LOANS

Money which must be paid back with interest. Federal student loan interest is lower than private loans. Two Types:

- Subsidized: Government pays down interest while student is in school
- Unsubsidized: the student is responsible for interest accrued while in school

SCHOLARSHIPS

FREE MONEY based on specific requirements or criteria. Students need to research and apply. Note that each scholarship has its own deadline.

Main Types:

- Local (high school & your town)
- University/College
- From Non-Profits & Businesses

Free Application for Federal Student Aid

- High school grad/GED holder
- Valid Social Security Number (SSN)
- Males can register for selective service (optional)

CADAA

Dream Act

- Meet AB540 Criteria
- Attend CA school for at least 3 full years
- High school grad/GED holder
- Males can register for selective service (optional)
- File an affidavit

GRANTS

- FREE MONEY for educational expenses based on financial need

WORK STUDY

- Jobs to help pay for school
 - Employment on campus
 - Up to 15 hours per week

LOANS

- Money which must be paid back with interest
- Two Types:
 - Subsidized: Government pays down interest while in school
 - Unsubsidized: Automatic monthly payments

SCHOLARSHIPS

- FREE MONEY based on specific requirements or criteria
- Main Types:
 - On Campus
 - National
 - Local (High School)
