### 3) Superintendent Report

#### **Superintendent Josh Hurt**

- Superintendent Josh Hurt announced to the board that the district had a successful start to the new school year. “As I enter my twenty-seventh year in education and fourth year as superintendent of Metcalfe County Schools, it might be the smoothest start to the school year that I have ever seen,” Hurt said. “We appreciate the hard work of our teachers, staff, students, parents, and community. And we look forward to a great year.”
- Item 5A asks the board to consider the emergency certification of a full-time math teacher at MCMS. A math teacher at MCMS resigned right before school started. If the item is approved, the teacher who is subbing at this time will be emergency-certified for the position.
- For item 5G, we have several option-6 teachers and emergency-certified teachers who are getting their education while teaching in the classroom. They have mentors through their universities, but the district would like them to have a mentor in-house available to help out when needed. The part-time mentor coach will help alleviate some of the stress and anxiety of first-time teachers. Item 5G would allow us to post the position.
- Item 5D is the tax rates. I recommend we keep the same rate at 51.7 cents per 100 dollars of assessed value plus .2 exonerations.
- On the salary schedule, bus drivers were getting \$10.75/hour for field trips. Action item 5E will increase that to \$12.50, comparable to surrounding school districts. The other change to the salary schedule refers to custodial work.
- Items 5H, 5I, 5J, 5K, 5L, 5M, 5P, and 5Q are all construction-based items that will help push forward the new art/multipurpose building project and the new athletics facilities project.

- Item 5N will update our contract with the company replacing the MCHS roof to ensure we comply with the Davis Bacon Prevailing Wage Act.
- Item 5O, will allow us to participate in the 2023-2024 KETS Offers of Assistance Program. There have been no monetary offers as of yet. If we accept any future offers this year, the district must match them financially.

BG-2s for both projects are detailed lists of what is going to be there. The design and development plans are a little more detailed with specific measurements.

- Regarding 5N and the prevailing wages, there is an issue across the state on the difference between a roofer and a sheet metal worker. This distinction will determine what the prevailing wage rate is for the MCHS roof project. We have paid the roofer rate at this time. The sheet metal worker rate is higher and will require more money paid by the district. That additional money, if required, would come from our ESSER fund.
- The final roof inspection is expected to happen in the next few weeks.
