




Walker. Hosted an Earth Day grounds clean-up, more than 30 people helped out!



Positive Impact: LED Lighting Upgrades



LED Lighting Upgrades at 11 Schools in Summer 2022

- Improved lighting levels for Students and Teachers
- Dimmable lighting options for Teachers
- 25% reduction in electricity used at 11 schools (Fall '21 vs Fall '22)
- Saving 233 metric tons CO₂, equivalent to 45 homes electricity use in one year

Renew America's Schools Grant



Pursuing a grant with U.S. Department of Energy, Energy Improvements at Public K-12 School Facilities - Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) - Renew America's Schools.

- ★ Submitted our Concept Paper submitted on January 26th.
- ★ Proposing upgrades at **7 school buildings** based on age and highest need for energy efficiency upgrades for a total **funding request of \$11,759,000**.
- ★ **We submitted a Full Application by April 21, awaiting decision this Summer.**

ComEd Carbon-Free Assessments



Completed 4 assessments in January and February:

Received reports from ComEd in late March, internally evaluating results and if we want to complete at remaining schools.
