Renew America's Schools Grant






Pursuing a grant with U.S. Department of Energy, Energy Improvements at Public K-12 School Facilities - Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) - Renew America's Schools.

- Submitted our Concept Paper submitted on January 26th.
- ★ Proposing upgrades at 7 school buildings based on age and highest need for energy efficiency upgrades for a total funding request of \$11,759,000.
- \star We're in the process of submitting a Full Application by April 21.
