Defining Family Engagement

Involvement vs. Engagement

- INVOLVEMENT: to enfold, wrap around, cover or envelop Involvement implies "doing to."
- ENGAGEMENT: to come together; to interlock
 Engagement implies "doing with."

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Examining Differences

INVOLVEMENT

- 1-way communication
- School-designed activities
- Exclusive
- Do "to"
- Select group of families or active parents

ENGAGEMENT

- 2-way communication
- Co-created activities
- Inclusive
- Do "with"
- Partnership, working together

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



Definitions of Family Engagement

- **Family Engagement** is any way that a child's adult caretaker (biological parents, foster parents, siblings, grandparents, etc.) effectively supports learning and healthy development at home, at school, and in the community. (Karen Mapp)
- Family Engagement is a full, equal, and **equitable** partnership among families, educators and community partners to promote children's learning and development from birth through college and career. (State of CT)












Students with Engaged Families...

- Exhibit faster rates of <u>literacy</u> acquisition
- Earn higher grades and test scores
- Enroll in <u>higher level</u> programs
- Are promoted more and earn more credits
- Adapt better to school and <u>attend</u> more regularly
- Have better social skills and behavior
- Graduate and go on to higher education


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
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Effective Partnership Strategies!
