

Proposed Elementary Boundaries Map



Dr. Bessie Rhodes was the first principal of the newly reopened Timber Ridge Magnet School. The school was later renamed in her honor.

How Was King Arts Developed?



- Following a decision of the D65 School Board to adopt a comprehensive all-school integration program, of which a laboratory school was an integral part, a K-5 integrated laboratory school was initiated at Foster School.
- In the fall of 1967, Foster elementary school, comprised of an entirely African American student population was integrated by adding a laboratory kindergarten class.
- As the declining student population was causing a number of Evanston's elementary schools to close (including Foster School), the King Lab project survived by combining with Skiles Middle School in the late 70s.
- The King Lab program shifted to the 2nd Ward in 1979, which is where the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Literary
 & Fine Arts School is now.



How Was Rhodes Developed?



The school opened in 1957 as a neighborhood school named Timber Ridge Elementary School. It opened and closed several times due to enrolment variances in the district.

The building had served a teachers training facility before it opened as Timber Ridge Magnet School in 1995. Ten years later it became the Dr. Bessie Rhodes Magnet School, the first educational facility in Evanston-Skokie school district to be named after an African-American woman.

The renaming of the school did not come easy. A committed group of Evanstonian's, led by retired schoolteacher Yvonne Davis, initiated the name change request before the District 65 school board in 2005. Thanks to their diligent efforts and growing support, the name change became a reality.



Rhodes Data - Est. 2005/6




