ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Albert Lea student participants must be making satisfactory progress in their courses to maintain their eligibility. **Students in 7th grade who are participating in Middle School and/or High School programs must earn passing grades in all classes.** Those students failing to meet these requirements will be put on academic probation. Final grades from their 6th grade will be used to determine eligibility for Fall programs in 7th grade.

BEHAVIORAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ACTIVITIES

SWMS requires all student participants be in good standing behaviorally to participate in activities. Students with an out-of-school suspension are not allowed to participate in practice and contests. Repeated disciplinary issues could impact participation in after school activities. These decisions will be made by the school Principals, Activities Director and the coaches.

PARENTVUE

Each parent will be assigned their own ParentVue account to use while their students attend Albert Lea Area Schools. In your account you will be able to access your student's grades, attendance, health office visits, and other information.

FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR STUDENTS

Before school: parents will enter the parking lot from Hwy 13 and drop students off in the “STUDENT DROP OFF ZONE”

Afternoons: parent must pick up their students on the east side of the school (facing Sibley) at door #7. Only busses are allowed in the west parking lot in front of the school in the afternoons.

SCHOOL DAY

The School Day begins at 8:30 and ends at 3:15. Students will be allowed in the building at 8:05 for breakfast or to sit in the stands. Unless students are involved in a supervised after school activity, they should be out of the building and off school grounds by 3:30 p.m.

ALLERGIES & DELIVERIES

We have students at SWMS who have life threatening allergies to latex, peanuts, and tree nuts. Any deliveries containing latex will be prohibited from entering the building. We request individuals to voluntarily refrain from sending/bringing any peanut or tree nut products or by-products into SWMS or to any school-related activities.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

If your student is going to miss school for any reason (this includes dental or hospitalization, funeral or court, please call the attendance line prior to 8:30 a.m. State your student's first and last name, student ID #, reason for absences and your name.

LEAVING SCHOOL DURING THE DAY

It is school policy that students may not leave the school grounds during the school day without permission from the office. **If your student needs to be excused during the school day for any reason, they will need to bring a note to the attendance office before school starts that morning OR a parent must call the attendance office.** The student will then be issued a pass to be excused at the appropriate time. DO NOT call/email your student's teacher to have them dismissed. ALL passes must come through the office. If a student is ill they must go to the health office. The health office will then call home if the situation requires the student to go home.

CAFETERIA

Cash is not accepted in the lunch line. Please use **Payschoolscentral.com** to deposit funds into your student's account. Do not bring food to share with others. Restaurant or fast food is not to be brought into the cafeteria.

Students are NOT to bring food items to share with others in the classroom

ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT & CELL PHONES

Cell phones and electronic devices may be used before and after school. Any electronic device brought to school must be turned off and kept in the student's locker during the school day. Any devices used or seen during the school day without permission will be confiscated and may be reclaimed from the office. Texting and internet social sites are not allowed during the school day. **Use of any device to record or take pictures are prohibited throughout the building.** Neither the school or the schools' representatives are liable for electronic equipment that is lost or stolen or confiscated.

DRESS CODE

Student dress should comply with reasonable standards of cleanliness, safety and should not be disruptive to the operation of the school or inappropriate for students. No hats or caps. Winter jackets must be left in lockers. Skirts/shorts must be fingertip length when arms are at the student's side. Clothing with spaghetti straps, halter tops and tube tops are not allowed. Undergarments including but not limited to bra straps and underwear cannot be showing. No cracks visible, front or back. Midriiffs must be covered front and back. Clothing with ads/pictures for alcohol, bars, dugs, tobacco or clothing of a sexually suggestive nature are not to be worn. Bags, purses and backpacks are to be locked in lockers.

The administration (or appointed designee) will be the final arbiter of what is appropriate dress.

MESSAGES & GIFTS FOR STUDENTS

In an emergency, parents may call the school office to leave a message for a student. Messages to students will be delivered at our convenience. Classes will not be interrupted for messages or phone calls. Students are encouraged to discuss appointment and after school plans before coming to school. forgotten items from home will be delivered at our convenience. Deliveries of gifts, flowers, plants and/or mylar balloons will be kept in the main office. Student will receive a note to pick up their items at the end of the school day.
