2023-2024 FACULTY

Diversity is reflected not only in the student body but also in the staff/administration. There is a blending of 52 national and international educators - 31 teachers or 60% are Jamaican, 7 teachers or 13% are American and 14 teachers or 27% are third-country nationals from Canada, UK, Australia, The Netherlands, Cuba, Grenada and Germany. 43 out of 52 educators, or 83% have earned a Masters or PhD degree.

CALENDAR

The school calendar includes two semesters. Semester 1 starts in August and ends in January. Semester 2 commences in January and finishes in June.

Total school days are 181. The school day starts at 7:45 AM and ends at 3:00 PM for all students.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

AISK provides English as an Additional Language (EAL) services for students who are non-native English speakers. Students are assessed using the WIDA Model to determine their English language proficiency in the areas of speaking, listening, reading, and writing. The scores determine their eligibility for EAL services. The WIDA Model is administered annually to monitor student progress and growth in their acquisition of the English language. Learning support is available for students identified as having mild learning needs. Eligibility for services requires a psycho-educational evaluation by a qualified professional. The results of the assessment help to determine the level of support the student requires, as well as any accommodations they may need to ensure they are successful in the classroom.

ACCREDITATION

In 2001, AISK received its initial accreditation with AdvancED now Cognia and reaccredited in 2019 until 2025. In 2008, the school was authorized to deliver the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme. AISK was re-authorised in 2020 until 2025.

ENROLMENT

There are 288 students, 153 (53%) boys, and 135 (47%) girls. 124 students are enrolled in Elementary School (43%), 68 in Middle School (24%), and 96 in High School (33%). 30 students made up the Class of 2023.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

AISK is an international school with an international standards-based curriculum designed to fit the needs of our diverse student body of college-bound students. The academic program provides three paths

to graduation. While all students earn a high school diploma, students can choose to also pursue the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma, or a selection of IB courses. The following IB courses are offered: English Language and Literature, Spanish, French, Economics, History, Business management, Environmental Systems and Societies, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Visual Arts, Music, and Theater. Students also have the option of taking IB subjects not currently offered by AISK using Pamoja online and we have had students take Psychology, Spanish Ab Initio, Digital Studies and Mandarin in previous years. By grade 9, students can choose the courses that best help meet their academic goals. Honors classes are offered in Mathematics in grades 9 and 10. Grade 10 students take an integrated science coure. Grade 9 and 10 students may also choose Visual Arts or any of our Performing Arts selections (Theater, Music, or Dance) and also choose language options between French and Spanish.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

AISK is a venue for artistic, musical, and dramatic productions as well as intramural and extramural sports events. Varsity sports are Football, Basketball, Tennis, Swimming, and Dance. Major sporting events from Middle School to Varsity are SoccerFeva (AISK), International Football Competitions (Bahamas and Dominican Republic), Tennis Feva (Jamaica), and local championships in Football, Tennis, Dance, and Swimming. Clubs include Student Government, National Honor Society, National Junior Honor Society, Model United Nations, Bookworm, Brownies, Cooking, Drone, Environmental, Film, Hurricane Hut, Kindness, Let's Play!, Peer Support, Art and Crafts, Global Issues Network (GIN), Key Club, Robotics, Chess, Coding, Taekwondo, Pickleball, Spanish, Stock Trading, Drama, Table Tennis, Taekwondo, Track and Field, Volleyball, Yearbook, Yoga, and Fencing. GRADING SYSTEM


