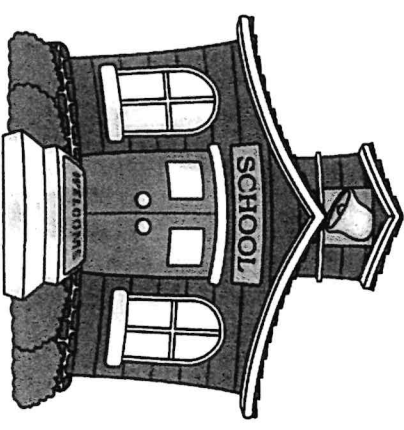

## Teachers, Parents, Students- Working Together for Success

### In the 2nd Grade Classroom

The second grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:


 Use a weekly newsletter to send tips home to parents for reading and math instruction.


 Send home books and/ or offer access to online libraries for students to extend reading outside of school.


 Communicate quickly and effectively regarding math facts and concepts to be practiced at home.

### 2nd Grade Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:

 Students will transport a weekly newsletter home to their parents and ask their parents to read it with them.

 Students will ask parents to read with them each night and bring books home from school/ online libraries.

 Practice math facts and concepts learned at school.

1. Eat breakfast.
2. Go to bed on time.
3. Come to school every day.
4. Practice schoolwork at home.

### **At Home**
