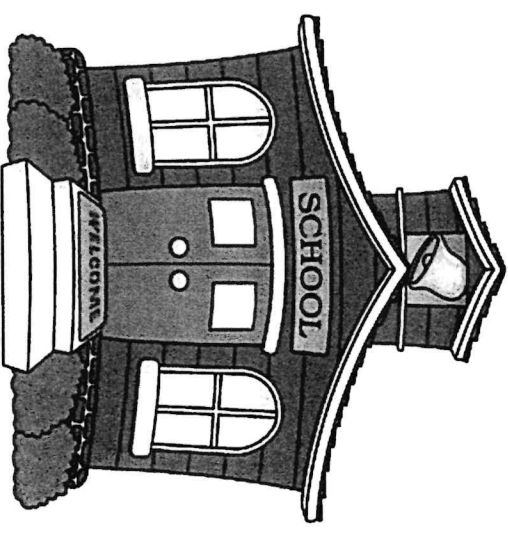

Teachers, Parents, Students- Working Together for Success

In the 3rd Grade Classroom

The third grade teachers will work with students and their families to support student success. Some of our key connections with families will be:


 Use weekly newsletters to provide online resources and suggestions for parents.


 Give ELA and Math spiral review pages for homework as a way to review and practice ongoing standards.


 Communicate I-Ready goals for each student with parents.

At Home

FFES parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support student success.

 Adults will go over weekly newsletters and use the provided resources with their child.

 At home, adults will go over math and ELA spiral review weekly with their child.


 At home, adults will encourage their child to work hard on iReady as well as ask for updates on progress towards iReady goals.

3rd Grade Students

Students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students shared the following ideas:

 Practice the resources sent home by my teacher.

 Complete ELA and Math spiral review pages each week.

 Aim to meet my weekly goal on iReady reading and math by passing 2 or more lessons a week with 80% or higher.



Teachers, Parents, and Students believe these additional key points will create success for our 3rd Graders this year:

- Read at least 20 minutes each night with an adult.
- Attempt all classwork and homework with their highest effort.
- Continually act responsibly, respectfully, and safely—both at home and at school.
