Review of Bylaws	Mrs. Emma Pereida-Martinez, Assistant Superintendent provided all representatives and guests with a copy of the DAC Bylaws in English and Spanish. She reviewed the purpose of these bylaws and explained the function of DAC which is to help our council continue to operate effectively to improve the programs in our district. The goals and objectives of the DAC are to review the Consolidated Programs, provide advice, assistance, and advisory recommendations to the Arvin Union School District on the Consolidated Funding Program, LCAP and provide input to educational projects funded under Title I and other State & Federal funding as needed/required. comments. Evelyn Torres made a motion to approve bylaws and Frank Davila seconded the motion, and bylaws were approved unanimously.

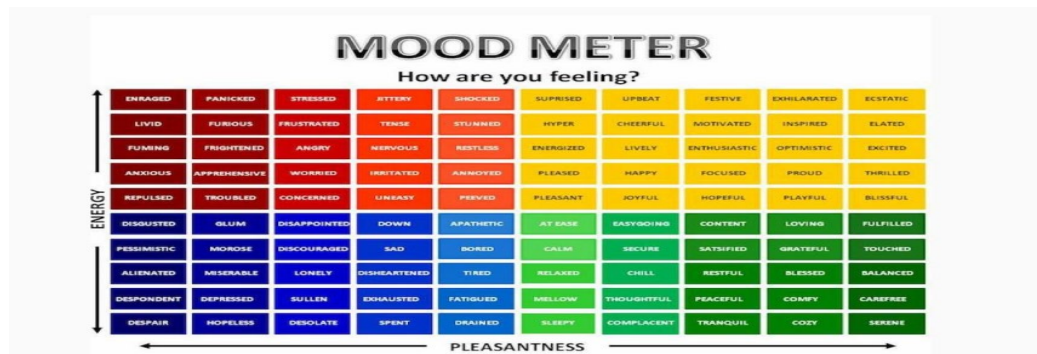
Collaborative Activity

Mrs. Emma Pereida-Martinez, Assistant Superintendent was pleased to announce that AUSD has adopted the evidence based RULER approach for TK-8 social emotional learning.

RULER is an acronym for the 5 key skills of emotional intelligence:

- **R**ecognizing emotions in ourselves and others
- **U**nderstanding the causes and consequences of emotions
- **L**abeling emotions accurately
- **E**xpressing emotions in accordance with cultural norms and social context
- **R**egulating emotions effectively

Attendees were given an opportunity to label their emotions on the MOOD METER



Uniform Complaint Procedures

Emma Pereida-Martinez, Assistant Superintendent, presented the Uniform Complaint Procedures (UCP). Electronic, as well as hard copies were provided in English and Spanish. The UCP has been updated for the 2023-2024 school year. The presentation of the UCP is required annually. The handout covers the scope of programs, laws, and protected bases upon which a complaint may be filed. It also includes a complaint timeline and a process for appeals. Sexual Harassment is not tolerated and is illegal. Staff, students, and community members are held to the same expectations - zero tolerance. Sexual harassment may be physical, verbal, or visual. The district prohibits discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying based on actual or perceived ancestry, color, disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, immigration status, nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or association with a person or a group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics. The District Office handles or assists with these types of complaints. Emma Pereida-Martinez asked if anyone had any questions or comments. No one had any questions or comments.
