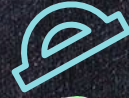


# James Monroe's Goals

# Parents' Right To Know

For a school receiving Title I funds, parents have the right to know:



The professional qualifications of their child's teachers and paraprofessionals; and

Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.





# Parent Engagement Requirements



## Annual Meeting

Federal guidelines require Title I schools to hold a parent meeting to explain and discuss the Title I program and requirements.



## Funding

The School District and all Title I schools must allocate at least one percent (1%) of the Title I budget towards programs and activities.

Title I schools are required to collaborate with parents in the School-Parent Compact and Parent Involvement Policy.

# School Involvement Policy/ School Compact

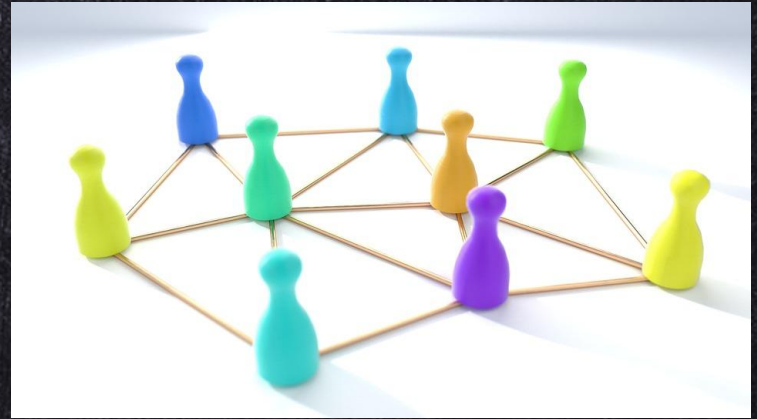
- Convene an annual meeting to inform parents of their rights to be involved in the Title I program and programs implemented.
