DID YOU KNOW?

As a destination school district and a growing county, the SWLS community is unfolding 23 distinct developments at various stages of completion. Among these, the noteworthy Forest Ridge development (North of Broad on Rt. 310) is poised to accomodate an estimated student population of 212. Similarly, the Broyles subdivision, at the intersection of Smoke and Refugee, is primed to welcome approximately 144 students, while the Eastwood project along Rt. 40 in Reynoldsburg is embarking on its first phase, projecting an enrollment of 77 students.

NAME THAT ELEMENTARY

In July of 2023, the District achieved another milestone with the ground breaking on a new elementary school on Watkins Rd. The building is designed to hold 800 students, 200 more than the capacity of our current elementaries. This progressive building is set to replace Pataskala Elementary when it opens. Under the guidance of an advisory committee, Pataskala Elementary will undergo a process of educational repurposing to determine its future.
