WHEREAS, the Board of School Directors conducted a public hearing on May 31, 2023, to consider a proposal to consolidate and/or reconfigure grade levels in District building at the conclusion of the 2023-2024 school year, and at least three months have passed since that public hearing in accordance with the requirements of the Public School Code, 24 P.S. §7-780; and

WHEREAS, the Board of School Directors of the Conneaut School District has determined that the plan of reorganization of District buildings as proposal by the Superintendent is in the best long-term interests of the District and the education of its students;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of School Directors of the Conneaut School District determine to reconfigure, reorganize, and consolidate the grade levels in the District buildings, as follows:

- (1) Reassign students in grade 5 from the middle school buildings to one of the two district elementary schools based upon attendance areas;
- (2) Consolidate all remaining middle school grades, grades 6-8, into a single middle school at the location of current Conneaut Lake Middle School, to be renamed as Conneaut Area Middle School;
- (3) Close Conneaut Valley Middle School at the end of the 2023-2024 school year; and
- (4) Direct the Administration to realign and/or furlough the staff of the District in accordance with the provisions of the Public School Code, 24 P.S. §§11-1124, 11-1125.1, and pursuant to the terms of the applicable collective bargaining agreements.

Board discussion included-

Mr. Burnham stated this recommendation by the Administration is not worth the paper it is written on. The excuse that Conneaut Valley is no longer getting reimbursement and the reason is that building was finished well before Conneaut Lake and started getting reimbursements when the others were under construction. Valley had already contributed money through reimbursement and secondly, one thing listed is putting all students together in the middle school 6th graders somehow becomes a happy family sooner. What that is admission of the current configuration is not having a happy family. That is a nonstarter. The distance of any busing has not been addressed in no shape or form. When the high school had the committees there were recommendations on what the extra busing time was and listed. But we haven't seen that. We don't know what the costs are and that is an insult to the public and the board. It was the same game 11 years ago, with that recommendation came into effect the world would end and the district would go into default. And after the fact an interview tithe tribune the superintendent admitted we were not as dire as stated but were being proactive. The business manager found 2 million more than though had. That person was never fired for incompetence. Why is that, here you are to vote the change and screw over the most income challenged area with no care from the rest of you. It doesn't matter if students travel 20 plus miles from Conneaut Lake or 25, that doesn't matter. I don't know what the thinking, so we have cyber. But how many 6=8 graders are capable of cyber education. He doesn't know those figures, any idea how many that age bracket try to do cyber. Has anyone explored that as he hasn't heard anything. He wants to amend the motion to say Move to amend that CVMS kitchen remain open to support meals to CVE and a computer lab to any valley student to district cyber classes.

There was no second so the amendment does not move forward.

Mr. Hall spoke- with this vote in the closing of CVMS, he feels it is important that Administration bring a plan to the October work session with what is to be accomplished by August, 2024. As a board we need to discuss this at every work session with a line item of what we are doing, how it is accomplished and through the entire process. We owe it to the public, staff, students in that plan we need to execute it with accuracy. There is sure to be some bumps, but we can navigate around them. The plan needs current spending for the current CVMS projects and to see the needs and wants, rank them for what do we need to do in the year and at no point sacrifice students. But we cannot spend money in that building on unnecessary items. Food service we cannot go into next year without a functional CVE kitchen We need a plan of bringing the communities together. Part of this is rebranding and we are no longer CLE if that is Conneaut Area Middle School. Mr. Hall corrected himself and said no longer CLMS, we need to rebrand. There are still instances and we to rebrand. He is challenging administration strongly as this has to be

on every agenda item, so we are making progress. We have a year and this has to be done well. It is one of the hardest decisions and I didn't' enjoy this vote but lets make us stronger educationally.

Mr. Horne spoke- he wanted to add two things relevant that Mr. Burnham raised some points. Mr. Burnham said kids are not coming together. I respectfully don't agree. Football games I have witnessed them unite and I agree this needs to be on the agenda. Administration coming in with clear transparent plans that allow the board and public to know and to start creating a Conneaut Area Middle School totally. It starts with us, administration and the public and we need to move forward. If you live in the past you die in the past, this is hard, I feel bad for those it affected but we need to keep looking into the future.

Mr. Klink agreed, during last wintertime we pulled together and brought committees to discuss what could be happening, and there was a great effort from the community. They deserve to know how moving forward, agenda line item helps all make this transition.
