



Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.




School Goals


Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.



Academic Progress


ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

Students earning a diploma within four years.






State Goals




