
We must move forward with our new facilities and facilities improvement program.







#### DFHS, IHS, CHS

- Each will continue as a traditional academic high school, maintaining its current attendance boundaries
- Each will offer one or more magnet programs
- Each will offer a broad range of elective courses

#### **NEW HIGH SCHOOL**

- Magnet High School with a specific, intentional "jobsfocus" serving students throughout the district
- All students will be required to earn certification in a career area as a criterion for graduation
- More options for flexible scheduling; fewer "non-CATE" electives
