DFHS, IHS, CHS

- **Each will continue as a traditional academic high school, maintaining its current attendance boundaries**
- **Each will offer one or more magnet programs**
- **Each will offer a broad range of elective courses**

SPRING HILL HIGH

- **Magnet High School with a specific, intentional “jobs-focus” serving students throughout the district**
- **All students will be required to earn certification in a career area as a criterion for graduation**
- **More options for flexible scheduling; fewer “non-CATE” electives**
