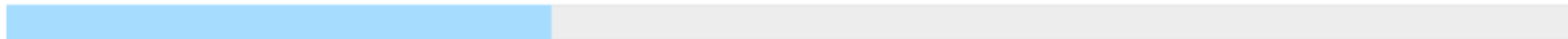

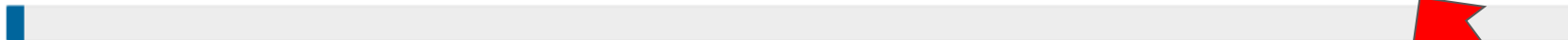
Students in the graduation cohort who are career ready 76.9% (1050 / 1366)



Students in the graduation cohort who have completed Career and Technical Education (CTE) with certification 34.8% (475 / 1366)



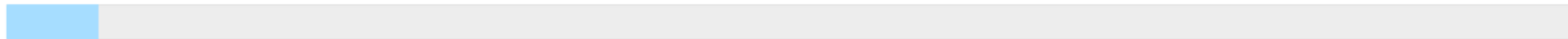
Students in the graduation cohort who completed a state-approved work-based learning experience 1.2% (17 / 1366)
