SCHOOL PROFILE 2023-2024

About Parish Episcopal School

Founded in 1972, Parish Episcopal School is a college-preparatory, independent day school accredited by the Independent Schools Association of the Southwest (ISAS), is a member of National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), College Board, National and Texas Associations of College Admission Counseling (NACAC and TACAC), the Association of College Counselors in Independent Schools (ACCIS), and the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS). A student-faculty ratio of 8:1 fosters a close professional atmosphere in the classroom and on the playing fields. At Parish, students are empowered to be authentic and prepared to lead with knowledge of and respect for a rich variety of people and points of view.

Mission

Inspired by our values of **Wisdom**, **Honor** and **Service**, Parish Episcopal School's inclusive Episcopal community guides young people to become creative learners and bold leaders prepared to impact our complex global society.

Belonging and Inclusion

Parish empowers its students to think critically, challenge bias, and advocate for diversity, equity and inclusion through programming, curriculum and conversations. The Parish Pathways program promotes civil dialogue and constructive action through advisory activities, affinity groups, Student Diversity Leadership Council, an annual Voices & Views Diversity Conference, interfaith chapel presentations, heritage month assemblies and community dinners.

Academy of Global Studies

AGS is a rigorous, four-year, outcomes-based research program equivalent to college coursework layered on top of Parish's graduation requirements. Selected students learn skills that culminate in a 20-page research paper on a student-selected issue of global or regional significance. It requires students to cite 30 primary sources and an oral defense in front of a faculty panel.

The Leadership Institute

The Leadership Institute requires students to complete coursework, workshops and a LEAD Project with the guidance of a professional mentor. Using design thinking, students address a local issue by completing a project that yields measurable outcomes. The Leadership Institute provides real-world experience that informs students' professional journeys through college and beyond.

ParishSTEM, including Rover

ParishSTEM integrates hands-on learning with unrivaled, state-of-the-art facilities to provide students with the skills needed to become the next generation of innovators. Parish's NASA HERC (Human Exploration Rover Challenge) team was named world champions in the high school division in 2021 and 2022.

Parish Bridge

Parish *Bridge* requires all students to complete five weeks of blended learning, including 15-80 hours of professional work experience, and life-readiness seminars the final trimester of senior year.

Academic Calendar

Rank and Transcript Notes

Parish does not rank its students. The weighted cumulative GPA is calculated on a 4.0 scale and only Parish and selected dual credit Dallas College courses are included. Credit earned before the freshman year does not appear on the transcript. A repeated course will appear on the transcript, and only the highest grade is calculated in the grade point average. There is no grade inflation at Parish.

AP Scores

Parish students are required to take the AP exam at the conclusion of each AP course. In 2023, **195** students took **390** AP tests, **77** students earned the honor of being named an AP Scholar.

Students customarily begin AP coursework junior year. Placement in AP courses requires a faculty recommendation. Students are strongly encouraged to maintain a healthy balance of academic rigor in grades 11 and 12. Upper School administration reserves the right to limit the number of honors or AP courses students take concurrently.
