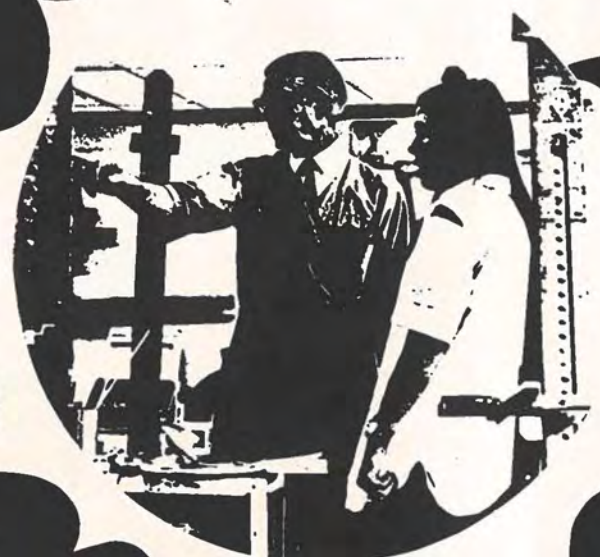

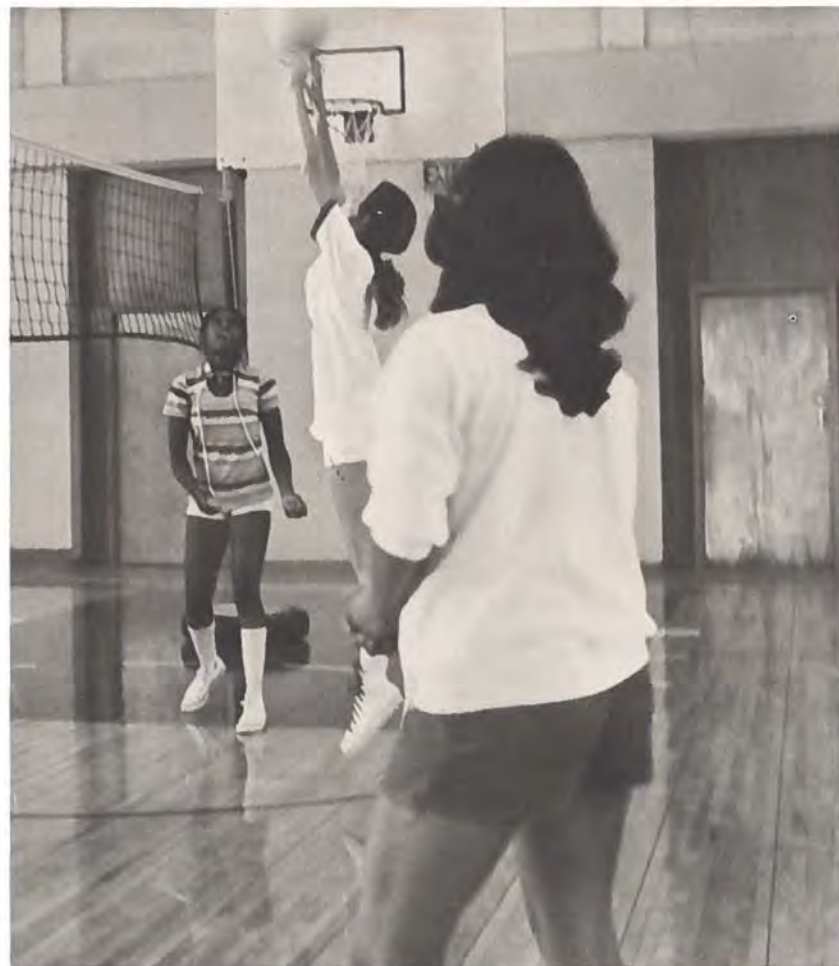

Athletics Improve Physical Fitness

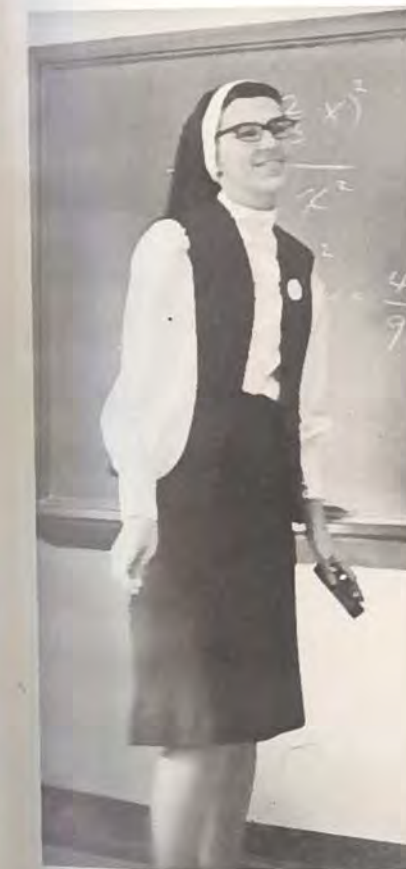

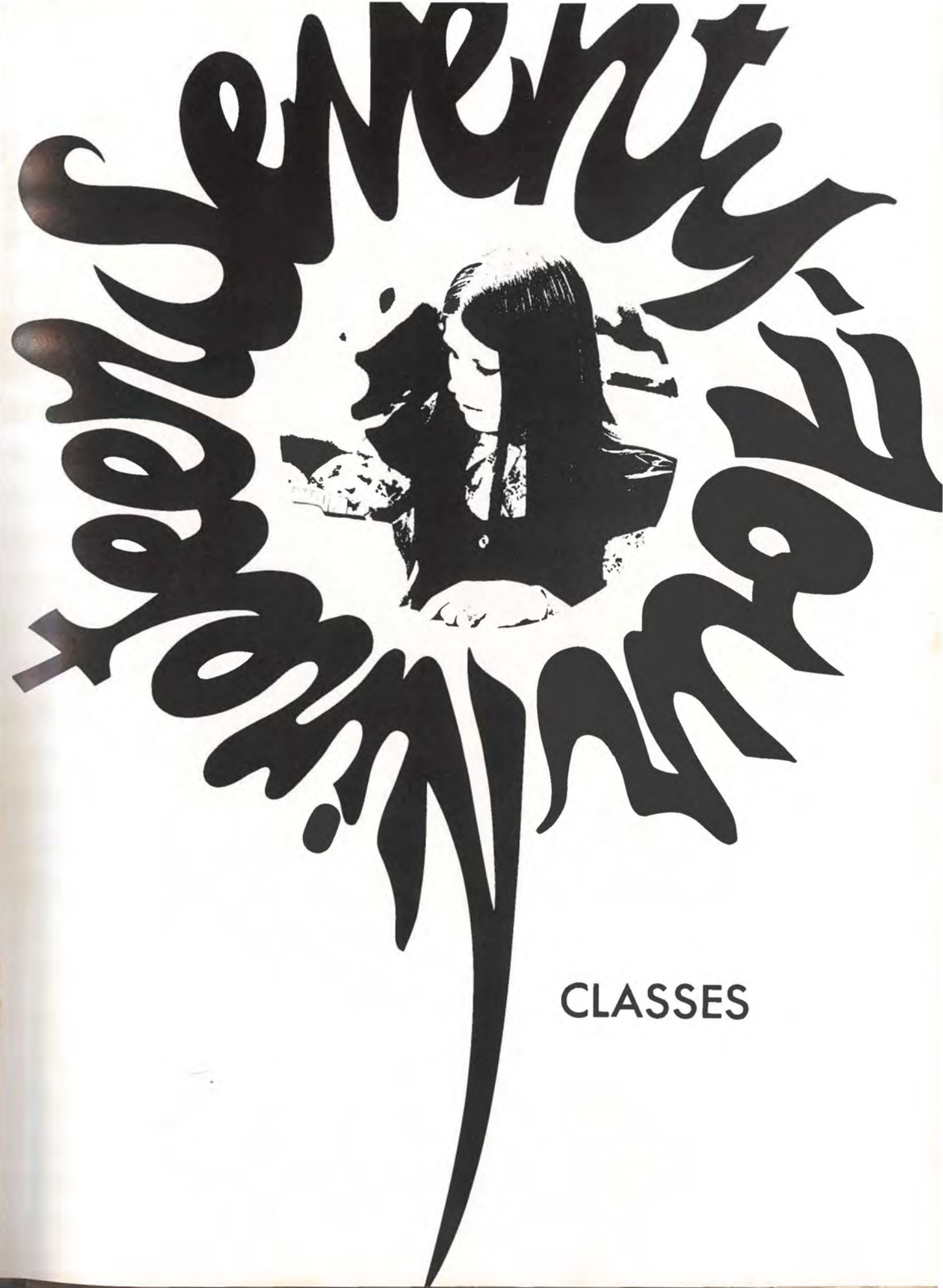

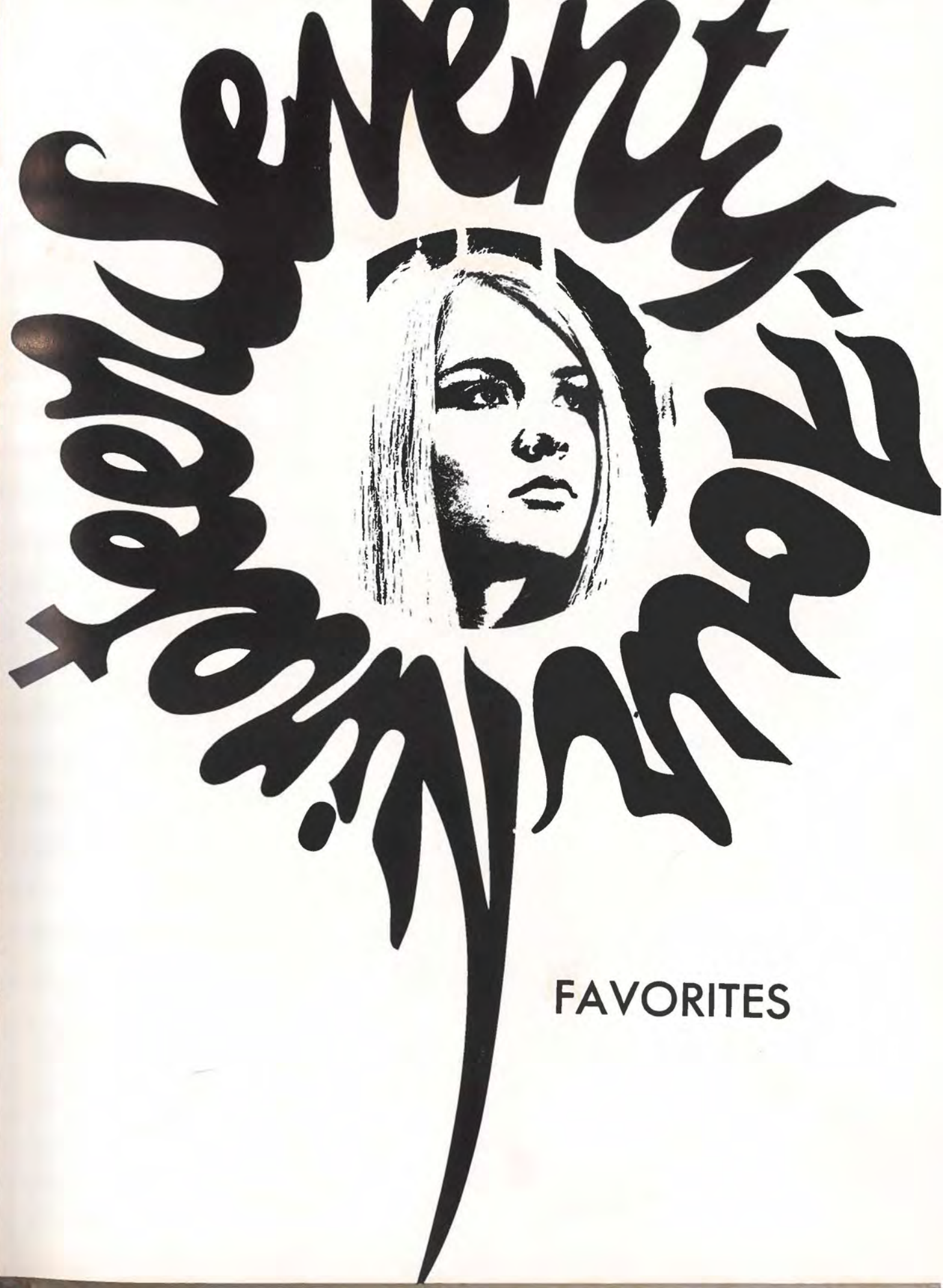

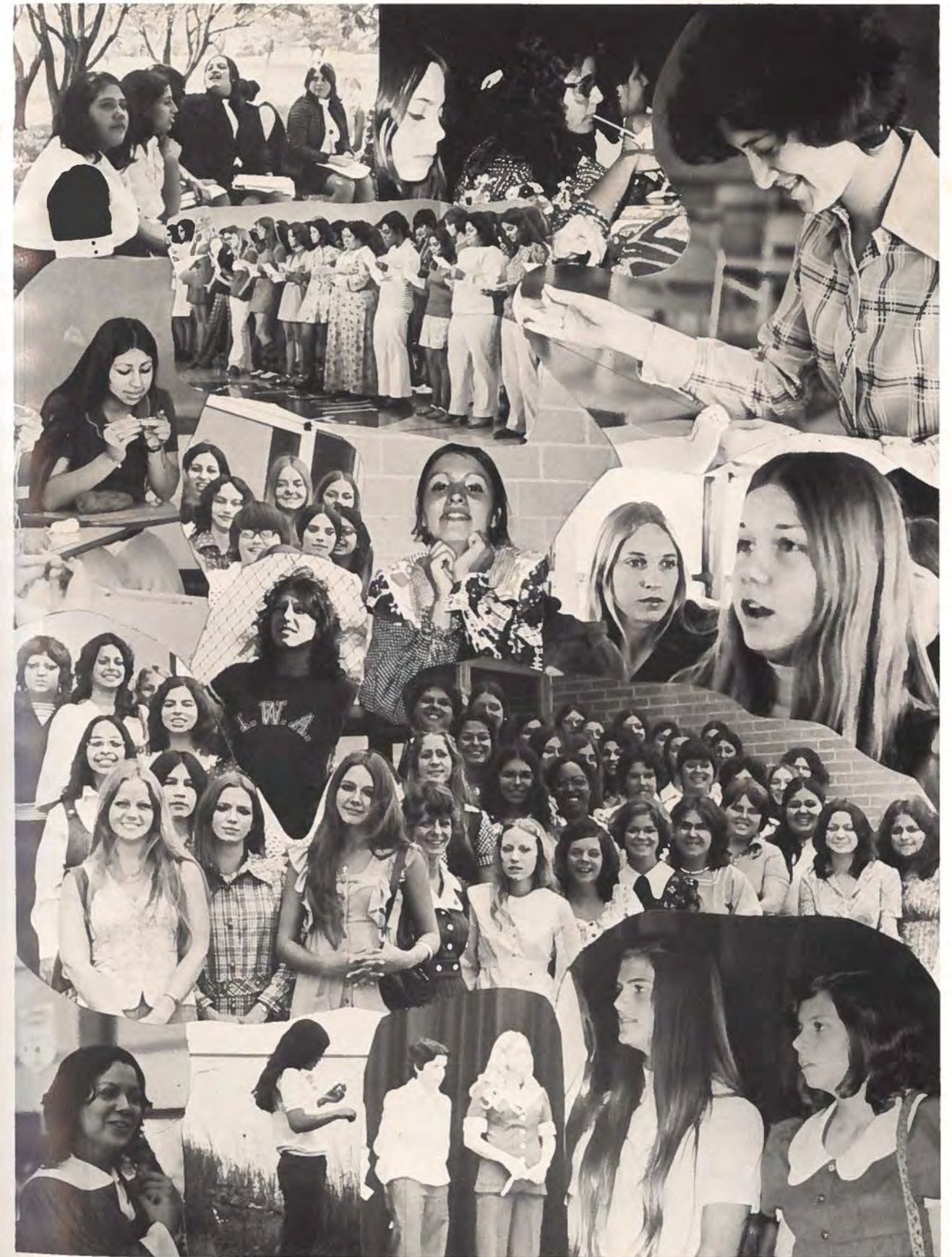
