How to Apply

To join UC's diverse and exciting community, prospective students must:

- Complete a UC application;
- Submit sixth-grade, seventh-grade and first marking period of eighth-grade report cards;
- Submit standardized test scores.
- Take the Coop High School Admission Test

Getting Here

UC draws students from 80 different communities within 11 counties; and is committed to assisting students in need of transportation.

- If your local Board of Education does not provide busing, UC will do so. (Fee required)
- Families whose towns are not included on our current busing schedule should contact the UC transportation department.

Tuition

Tuition is payable in twelve monthly installments.

- A tuition reduction is available to students whose full tuition is paid early.
- A reduction is available to students whose parent(s) are alumni or are employed full-time as Catholic elementary or secondary school teachers.
- A reduction is available to families that have more than one child attending UC at the same time.
- Speak to the tuition office about alternate payment plans.

Scholarships


A variety of Union Catholic Scholarships are awarded to incoming freshmen who have an excellent academic history, have demonstrated a steadfast commitment to their academics and have demonstrated outstanding character and leadership qualities through their extra-curricular activities.

Annual Scholarship Testing Program

UC Scholarships are granted to incoming students with outstanding scores on the UC Scholarship Exam. This exam is given the first weekend in December of the student's eighth grade year.

Merit Scholarships

Merit Scholarships are awarded to incoming freshmen with an excellent academic history, including a review of their grades and test scores.

- Ministers (students) plan and facilitate UC's Days of Recollection, liturgical celebrations, and social justice initiatives.
- Comprised of juniors and seniors, the ministry invites all students to participate in open events.

School Masses

- Masses for each grade during Orientation Week.
- Masses during Days of Recollection, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Holy Week, Graduation, and Holy Days of Obligation.
- Prayer services held throughout the year. (such as 9-11 and Ash Wednesday).

Union Catholic's six levels of learning from Advanced Placement to Freshman Foundations provide students with the educational tools they will need to succeed in the Real, Spiritual and Virtual Worlds.

Canvas

This easy-to-use cloud-based learning management system (LMS) brings together the digital tools that teachers and students use most often. It integrates seamlessly with hundreds of apps, making it easy to study and learn on all devices, any time, anywhere

Zoom

This modern video communications tool includes a cloud based platform for audio and video conferencing, chat and webinars, making it easy to teach and learn on all devices, anytime, anywhere.

Virtual Library

The UC virtual library puts more than 16,000 sources of data at students' fingertips, making it easy to study and fun to learn. At UC, students stay engaged.

Virtual High School Collaborative (VHS)

The Virtual High School partnership allows UC students to choose from more than 250 online courses.

Dual-Enrollment: Fairleigh Dickinson University

All of UC's Advanced Placement courses are available for dualenrollment (high school and college credit) through Fairleigh Dickinson University. Students who complete these courses successfully can transfer credit to the college of their choice.

Dual Enrollment: St. Thomas Aquinas College

Our arrangement with St. Thomas Aquinas College enables honor students to study English 101 and 102 online for high school and college credit.

School Counseling

Every student is assigned a counselor who will support them throughout their UC career. The school counseling office offers:
