Greg Coutu was a letterman for the varsity wrestling team from 1996 to 1999, and for the varsity baseball team in 1998 and 1999. He was an individual state champion in wrestling in 1998 and 1999, and was a member of the region championship wrestling teams in 1997, 1998 and 1999, and state runner up team in 1997. He was a member of the All Region Wrestling team in 1997, 1998, and 1999. Greg was a part of a very special time for SHS wrestling under the coaching of Andy Smyth. The wrestling team was dominate and made it to the Upper State Finals all 3 years Greg wrestled, and to the State Finals in 1997. 1999 was an incredible year for the Mat Cats as they qualified 10 individuals to the State Tournament (top 8 in the state at that weight class), had 6 of those wrestlers place in the top 4 and 3 State Champions including Derrick Johnson, Tony Butler and Greg Coutu. In only 3 years, Greg was able to win 93 matches and is still the only Mat Cat to have won multiple State Championships. The coaching, history, and men in that room are to be credited with Greg's success. Greg went on to graduate from Clemson in 2003 and then marry his high school sweetheart, Lindsey Stevenson Coutu. They have 2 daughters that attend SHS, Ally a senior and Nora a sophomore. Greg and Lindsey have been proud to live in and support their hometown of Seneca. Greg has built a successful real estate business and enjoys giving back to the community that has given him so much.

Dexter Webb was an All Region player for the Bobcat Basketball team in 1995 and 1996, and was named All State as a senior. He played in the North-South All Star game in 1996. After high school, Dexter signed with Otero Jr College in Colorado, and went on to sign with division 1 Tennessee-Martin after junior college, the only player out of his class at Otero to sign with a division 1 school. He graduated with a 3.6 GPA, and made the dean's list at Otero before becoming a 2 year starter at UT-Martin. He enlisted in the Army on April 24, 2000 and has served a total of 22 years both as an enlisted Non-commissioned Officer and Commissioned Officer. MAJ Webb has three combat tours to Iraq, Kuwait, and Qatar. His other overseas tours include two extended hardship tours in South Korea. Dexter currently holds a Bachelor of Science degree in computer studies from the University of Maryland, Master of Arts from Webster University in information technology management, and a Masters of defense and strategic studies from Naval War College. Dexter's awards and decorations include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Joint Service Achievement Medal, and Army Achievement Medal.
