International Community School serves 410 students in grades 6-12 from throughout the Lake Washington School District, the second largest public school district in Washington State. As a choice school, our students are admitted through a lottery system with most students entering at sixth grade. All 46 members of the class of 2023 graduated on time, with their cohort.

ICS was born of community action in 1997 when parents and educators came together to create and support a small, rigorous secondary program with an international focus building global awareness. We continue to have a strong foundation of community partnership and support.

Our complex curriculum emphasizes interconnected learning and depth of understanding. Our small size and seven-year program allow for strong long-term relationships between students and teachers.

Accreditation and Recognition

ICS has met the requirements established by the AdvancED Accreditation Commission and is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission. ICS is also a State Recognized School as certified by the Washington State Board of Education, Educational Opportunity Gap Oversight and Accountability Committee, and Office of Superintendent of Public Education for high achievement in ELA, Math, Graduation Rate, and SQSS measures.
