



# Rules and Regulations

1. Upon arrival at Camp, the leader of your group should register with the Program Director on duty at the designated camp office. Families check in at the Ray Bean Camp Office unless otherwise stated.
2. The waterfront shall be under the supervision of the YMCA Camp Staff. No swimming or boating is allowed without the strict adherence to the Camp Waterfront Rules. The rules are posted by the swimming area.
3. No swimming without a YMCA Camp Lifeguard on duty.
4. **Lifejackets MUST BE WORN** by everyone engaged in water activities outside of the swimming area. This includes the use of lifejackets while boating or on the barge ride.
5. Fires are to be built in the fire pits provided. A fire built outside of a fire pit is dangerous and permanently scars the land. **No fires are allowed during a fire ban.** We will notify you of a fire ban.
6. Drive only on designated roads. **DO NOT DRIVE PAST POSTS!** Vehicles should remain parked for the duration of your stay. Off-road vehicles such as motorcycles, ATVs and 3-wheel type vehicles are not allowed at Camp. A designated emergency vehicle should be parked facing the road.
7. Do not remove furnishings from any of the buildings.
8. **Use of alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs is strictly prohibited on any YMCA property.**
9. Use of tobacco products by anyone under the age of 18 is strictly prohibited.
10. Smoking is not allowed in any Camp building.
11. Buildings and facilities not contracted for are "off limits."
12. No use of foul language and no rock or stick throwing is allowed at Camp.
13. All long distance phone calls must be made "collect" or by the use of a calling card or a mobile phone. There is a phone located by each camp office for use in making a call collect or with a calling card.
14. Groups using the Camp will assume full financial responsibility for damage to Camp property.
15. Camp and cabins are to be left clean. A \$500 fine will be levied if facilities are left abused or vandalized (this includes graffiti).
16. No pets of any kind are allowed at Camp.
17. YMCA Camp Grady Spruce is not responsible for items left behind.
18. No firearms or fireworks (explosives) of any kind are allowed. **This rule will be strictly enforced.**
19. No one under the age of 18 is allowed to ride in the back of any pick-up style vehicle while on CGS premises.

**This is a Texas state law and will be strictly enforced.**

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I hereby request my family and/or group (camper) is accepted to attend YMCA Camp Grady Spruce. I fully understand and am fully aware that campers will be participating in many physical activities and that the potential for accidents does exist. In consideration of acceptance to Grady Spruce:

I grant permission for Grady Spruce to provide or obtain medical attention for campers in the event of sickness or injury and I understand accident insurance is not included in the camp fee. Should a camper require special medical treatment, prescriptions or hospital care during the time at camp, designated responsible party shall bear the expenses.

By my signature and of my free will, I do hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless the YMCA of Metropolitan Dallas from any and all claims or demands, cost or expense arising out of any injuries, damages or other losses, whether personal or property, sustained by me or any party to whom I am responsible.

I agree to abide by the Rules and Regulations stated above.
