

COURSE NOTES:

- Advanced Topics in Mathematics is the capstone of our mathematics program and covers topics in Differential Equations, Multivariable Calculus, Linear Algebra, and Discrete Mathematics.
- The Minnesota Bilingual Language Seal is awarded to students
 who have demonstrated proficiency in languages other than
 English. The required proficiency levels are ACTFL Advanced Low
 for a Platinum Seal; ACTFL Intermediate High for a Gold Seal in all
 of the four modalities—listening, reading, speaking and writing.
- As part of their four-year plan, **90%** of the OHS Class of 2024 enrolled in academic programs that could lead to college credit: AP; Dual Enrollment (PLTW, College Accounting, Computer Applications for College); PSEO; and Hennepin Technical College Career Pathways.
- Marketing Seminar is our highest-level business course requiring students to create a business plan and/or community-based project to present at the state DECA competition.
- The **Senior Spartan Experience** is a culminating career-development project giving seniors an interactive mentorship experience that connects high school learning to post-secondary aspirations.

GPA Calculations

GPA is calculated on a four-point scale. Honors, Enriched, and AP courses are given a weighting of one extra point (A=5). Transcripts reflect BOTH weighted and standard GPAs.*


