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What is Expanded Learning?

"Expanded Learning" means before school, after school, summer and/or intersession learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of students through hands-on, engaging learning experiences.

Expanded Learning programs are student-centered, results driven, include community partners, and complement activities in the regular school day and school year

- A student who qualifies for Free or Reduced-Price Meals (FRPM)
- A student who is an English Learner



Vision, Mission, and Purpose




Our vision and mission is to work in partnership with parents, the District and community to provide a safe and nurturing program that promotes growth in the social, cognitive and physical development of each student.
