HOW THE OUTREACH PROGRAM WORKS

If, due to a lack of housing, you are:

- Living in a shelter
- Living in a vehicle
- Living at a campground
- In jail without a place to live after
- On the street
- Staying in abandoned and/or condemned buildings
- In the hospital without a place to live after
- Facing eviction due to back rent/utility payments
- Doubled-up with relatives or friends

And have a mental illness or believe you may have a mental illness; you may be eligible for PATH.

WHAT INDIVIDUALS NEED TO KNOW

People who are homeless are people first. You also may have disorders including serious mental illnesses and substance use. The fact that you have an illness doesn't diminish your rights, your responsibilities, or your dreams.

WHAT IS PATH?

The PATH Outreach Program is for Individuals and Families in Armstrong & Indiana Counties and is funded by the **Program for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH)**. It is provided through a collaboration of the Armstrong Community Action Program and Family Psychological Associates to support the needs of homeless and imminently homeless individuals and families who have a mental illness or co-occurring (mental illness and substance abuse) issues.

WHAT TYPE OF SUPPORT CAN INDIVIDUALS RECEIVE?

Our goal is to help people with the resources they need to obtain or keep secure housing. We work with people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. We may offer the following assistance:

- Referrals for mental health
- Referrals for chemical dependency
- Help obtaining food, clothing, and housing supplies
- Securing health insurance
- Referrals for dental and medical services
- Community education & speaking engagements
- Help with school issues, referrals or concerns
- Assistance obtaining ID
- Creating a budget and employment advocacy
- Housing and other community resource information

Although we may provide referral information, we **DO NOT** provide emergency housing.
