West Leyden unveils ——


student-inspired art

At an all-school assembly in August, students got their first look at artwork that will be on permanent display in the halls of West Leyden. In a design collaboration process led by professional artist Victor Montañez, a group of students and staff came together throughout the spring and summer to create five interchangeable panels that tell the story of their school.

"The art installation is aimed at continuing to create an educational environment that represents the cultures of the students who attend school here," said Principal Dr. Arturo Senteno. "We want our students to be involved, connected and kind, and we feel this art helps ground us all in what unifies us as West Leyden."

The mixed media paintings will be displayed in the hallway near the library at West Leyden.

"I really hope that when students walk down the hallway and see this mural, that they see themselves in it and then they feel like, 'Oh, that's me," said West Leyden Student Equity Board Member Grace Dillion. "The photo is for them. It's not just for us, it's for everyone that goes to Leyden."



Represents the connection of directions through visualization of the Des Plaines River. A carp fish represents the north, condor bird for the south, and a two-headed dragon for east and west - much like East Leyden and West Leyden. The Student Equity Board is shown gesturing signs of love to everyone. Two people are seen holding a blanket showing the power of human connections. This piece is meant to convey the messages of unity, leadership and strength. The rising sun depicts the start of a new day.




Panel 2

Eagle depicts our cultures: the White Eagle ("bialy orzel"). From American to Polish culture, the eagle represents the same: pride and strength. This bird, being used in many different countries as an emblem, shows the overall similarities that so many cultures share. It not only shows the connection between cultures but also represents Leyden and our diversity. Despite being our country's bird or the school mascot, the eagle represents so many different things to all cultures making it even more impactful. Within this part of the mural, there is also a phoenix rising from the ashes, following the path meant for us, not the one we are meant to take. While this path could take us anywhere, our roots will always be here, within these walls as a Leyden Eagle.

Panel 3

"El Corazon" or the heart, representing not only the soul of our school and spiritual body but the pride and integrity that we have as whole. El Corazon is a collection of abstract art with bright and vibrant colors that fills one with curiosity and perspective. More than 30 amazing leyden eagles contributed to this masterpiece. Aside from El Corazon which is the main piece of the panel that connects all of us and represents us as whole, we also have the Elk, which is symbolic as it represents the strength, endurance, and patience that we have as a school and community.

There is also a young girl who is pouring blood into the water, feeding with nourishment all that we contribute to our community and school. As a school we are one and El Corazon is a great way to include everyone and show that everyone is a part of something incredible and that we are united. Our soul is ever present to this school and the more we put in the more it creates a centerpiece of learning and unity.

Panel 4

Represents the life, nourishment, and energy we give to each other. The Mexican eagle or "aguila" not only represents the culture of many of the students but also the strength and majesty within. The eagle is holding a serpent shaped into a musical note. That music is what holds us together universally, especially here at leyden, evident through our amazing fine arts program, the groups that exist outside of leyden, and the great taste in music of our own levden students. The land represented also reminds of the shared resources that we value through corn and fish. Protecting our natural resources and paying homage to all those who have come before us shows our commitment to conservation. The cemetery in the background also reminds us of our own mortality in the sunset.

Panel 5

Depicts the Chicago skyline, the Des Plaines River, the moon, trees with faces in them, our deans dancing around a fire, falling feathers and a girl holding a paintbrush causing a ripple in the water. A mural can be interpreted in many different ways as they say "art is in the eyes of the beholder." Our interpretation of this part of the mural is that no matter how small someone may think they are, the effect they can have could change the world.

Belback posthumously added

to Leyden Wall of Fame

This fall, Leyden inducted five amazing graduates onto its Wall of Fame, including Tommy "Mugs" Cain, Justyna Kedra, Dr. Lou, **Dr. Donald Chmielewski** and posthumously, Joseph (Joe) Belback, West Leyden, Class of 1977. Mr. Belback, "Joe," was added after the initial feature story was published in this newsletter, and so we wanted to share his story with our community.

Joe's mechanical genius and love of physics at Leyden

eventually led him to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (M.I.T.) where he pursued a degree in Electrical Engineering. Joe went on to work on the original MRI machine technology. He later designed the hardware for several Electro Optical/ Infrared high-resolution

thermal imaging cameras used to secure our borders and our capitol after 9/11.

"Joe left an incredible legacy both professionally developing leading edge technology, and personally, embraced life to the fullest, providing an example to inspire all," said his brother Greg Belback.
