Santa Barbara County School Safety Symposium

SBCEO convened the Santa Barbara County School Safety Symposium (day 2) on October 9 and again on October 23. Speakers from the I Love U Guys Foundation presented on the Standard Response Protocol (SRP), which is used in the event of school-related emergencies. Our audience consisted of public and private TK-12 schools, preschools, community colleges and universities, law enforcement, behavioral wellness, and emergency service personnel. Bridget Baublits shared requirements and

recommendations related to Comprehensive School Safety Plans. Please see the SRP at the end of this report and find our new webpage for school safety resources at www.sbceo.org (look for the tab "School Safety Resources").

Student Advisory Council

The 2nd annual Santa Barbara County Superintendent's Student Advisory Council for 2023-24 is ready to launch! Twenty-one high school students from throughout the county have been invited to participate on this year's council. I look forward to meeting with the council members on Saturday, October 28 for the first of four in-person meetings.

Debra Hood has announced her departure from SBCEO, and her final day with us is October 31, 2023. Debra has created and strengthened numerous partnerships for us at SBCEO, and we thank her for 16 years of service and leadership.

SBCEO DIVISIONS

Administrative Services Division

E-Safety Network Meeting: SBCEO conducted a meeting for district IT professionals on October 25 at Santa Ynez Valley Union High School. The topics included cybersecurity, cyber attack reporting, network privacy, and broadband infrastructure. This meeting provided an opportunity for district IT professionals to collaborate and share e-safety practices and resources.

SBCEO Unaudited Actuals: Internal Services closed out the 2022-23 fiscal year. The SACS Unaudited Actuals report was completed and submitted to the CDE on October 13.

SBCEO State and Federal Reporting: Internal Services completed various state and federal reporting deadlines in the month of October. The reports addressed grants and programs such as ESSER, ELO-G, Educator Effectiveness Fund, SIPE annual Office of Self Insurance Plans, and the System for Award Management renewal.

District Unaudited Actuals: SBAS district financial advisors have completed their review of district and charter 2022-23 unaudited actuals. All unaudited actuals were reviewed and successfully uploaded to the CDE by October 15.

Curriculum and Instruction Division

Bilingual Authorization Program Receives Accreditation: On October 26, SBCEO received accreditation for our fourth credential program. The Bilingual Authorization Program will allow us to offer in-service, credentialed teachers a one-year program to certify them to teach in any dual language environment. We will begin our first cohort in the spring.

Inclusion Network – A Focus on Students with Disabilities: After an analysis of student outcomes last spring, the district superintendents agreed to a countywide collective focus on outcomes for students with disabilities. Through a collaboration among C&I, the county SELPA, and our county districts and charters, we have reinstated the inclusion network we began before the pandemic. On October 24, Kevin Schafer, director of inclusive practices from Supporting Inclusive Practices (SIP), joined us for a full day of planning support with teams from across the county. We will be examining the structural, cultural, and instructional features of systems that support and inhibit inclusivity and outcomes for students.

SEL Community of Practice: We have continued the Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) Community of Practice. Now in its fourth year of supporting schools and districts, we are providing wide-ranging supports for student and educator well-being. Additional fall offerings included grants to an educator well-being institute, in addition to our ongoing community of practice. We have completed two of the six sessions. We are recruiting educators for full scholarships to complete a certification in SEL Foundations from UC Berkeley.

Computer Science – Jump Into CS: SBCEO is the regional lead for the Computer Science Educator Workforce Improvement Grant (CS-EWIG). We have identified and convened our regional CS champions. As part of our "Seasons of CS" trainings, we have offered two fall trainings called Jump into CS, where teachers will explore CS activities and develop lesson plans for integrated CS lessons.

LCAP Training and Support for 2024-25 Kicking Off: The State Board of Education is set to approve the new template and the one-time annual update next week at the November 8-9 meeting. The new LCAP template must incorporate 15 additional requirements legislated this past year. Our LCAP team kicked off our multi-faceted plan of support for our local educational agencies on November 1. All local educational agencies are embarking on a new three-year LCAP cycle. We are using this opportunity to support districts and charters with their needs assessments, their intentions to improve coherence and throughlines, identify meaningful metrics tied to meaningful actions. We will be offering the 3 modules with north and south county options for each, as well as customized supports for the districts that cannot make the workshops. The

training on the new template will align with the statewide training our office will be helping to develop.

Spring 2023 CAASPP, ELPAC, and Chronic Absenteeism Reports

CAASPP: The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) scores from tests administered in spring 2023, were released to the public on Wednesday, October 18, 2023. CAASPP data show California public school student performance in English language arts and math in grades 3-8 and 11. Overall, results indicate that Santa Barbara County scores have remained relatively stable from last year, and that we continue to see the effects of the pandemic in key areas.

ELPAC: Students who are identified as English Learners take a summative English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC), which indicates their level of proficiency in acquiring the skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English. In Santa Barbara County, 26.1% of students are identified as English Learners. Of the 58 counties in California, Santa Barbara County ranks 5th in the number of English Learners.

CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM: The state also released data about rates of student chronic absenteeism. The results show signs of improvement in Santa Barbara County with chronic absenteeism rates decreasing for all student groups.

CA DASHBOARD: In December, the state Department of Education plans to release the 2023 California School Dashboard which measures state and local rates of absenteeism, graduation, suspension, and English learner progress.

SBCEO's Curriculum and Instruction team will be providing data visuals and graphs to support districts and schools as they communicate their results to their school communities.

Special Education Division

On October 4, the SBCEO Deaf and Hard of Hearing program staff in Santa Maria and Orcutt began the 2023/2024 American Sign Language (ASL) community classes. These classes are held at Dunlap Elementary School and are free for anyone who would like to attend. The classes are taught by one of SBCEO's Deaf and Hard of Hearing teachers, Torry Muscio. The team is offering two five-week courses. Many family members of our students attend in order to learn how to communicate with their child using ASL. Free child care is offered during these classes.

Student and Community Services Division

Career Technical Education (CTE)

North County Teacher Tours: The 2nd north county CTE teacher tours occurred on October 4. Four SMJUHSD CTE teachers toured the following businesses:

South County Teacher Tours Update: The October 9 Carpinteria High School teacher tour event was well received. The SBCEO CTE Department supported conversations around the structure and content for the day, which included frontloading industry leads in pre-meetings with context for the tour, talking points, and connections to classroom instruction. CHS teachers visited Agilent, Curvature, and the UCSB NanoFab facility. South county teacher tours for CTE teachers will begin this spring. Please find a news article about this Carpinteria High School teacher tour at the end of this report.

Allan Hancock College Career Carnival: Allan Hancock College (AHC) hosted its annual 8th grade Career Carnival on October 13 for Santa Maria Valley 8th graders. It was a great way for students to engage with Santa Maria Joint Union High School District (SMJUHSD) and AHC counselors, advisors, and CTE faculty as they consider possible options for future careers. The SBCEO CTE Department hosted a booth where students engaged in conversations related to connecting their career interest survey responses with possible career pathways and industry sectors. Representatives from SMJUHSD and AHC included public service, agriculture, culinary arts, auto, engineering, and the Mark Richardson CTE Center and Agriculture Farm.

Children's Creative Project (CCP)

On November 8, the CCP board will host a mixer at the Alhecama Theater in Santa Barbara from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. to introduce staff and programs to community members. Early Care and Education (ECE)

ECE Staff Attend Audacious Foundation Retreat: Early education and transitional kindergarten (TK) administrators and teachers from Santa Barbara County attended the Audacious Foundation retreat, held from October 12 to 14. The retreat provided a deep dive into the significance of outdoor play, equipping educators with invaluable insights into nurturing resilience and self-care in young children. Senator Monique Limón presented the critical role of childcare in bolstering the workforce, emphasizing the demand for high-quality early education, and articulating the purpose of TK.

The retreat concluded with immersive tours of three outdoor classrooms that inspired the participants. Additionally, each attendee was generously awarded grant funds from both First 5 Santa Barbara and the Audacious Foundation, offering the means to enhance their outdoor learning environments.

Juvenile Court and Community Schools (JCCS)

FitzGerald Community School Field Trip to NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL): On November 6, students from FitzGerald will be given a behind-the-scenes look at NASA's only federally funded research and development center managed by Caltech in Pasadena. This field trip provides students the opportunity to learn about NASA's 40 current projects. The tour includes the opportunity to view 1:1 scale models of the five Mars Rovers, a visit to the Mission Control Center, and the opportunity to learn about careers available at JPL.

FitzGerald Community School Student Receives a Free Bike: In partnership with Santa Maria-Bonita School District, CommUnify, and SBCEO, a FitzGerald student received a free bicycle on September 28. Earlier this year, the student had reported to FitzGerald staff that he was having difficulty getting to school on time, so the staff devised a plan to help. After receiving the bike, the student's attendance has improved.

Student and Community Services (SCS)

Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI): Multi-payer Fee Schedule Update: Four school districts (Carpinteria, Lompoc, Guadalupe, and Santa Maria-Bonita) and SBCEO's FitzGerald Community School have applied to participate in a Learning Cohort for the Multi-payer Fee Schedule. The fee schedule will be operated by the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) and provides participating school districts the opportunity to bill Medi-Cal and commercial insurance for behavioral health services. DHCS will make final decisions on Learning Cohort participants on December 1, 2023, with implementation beginning January 1, 2024. Participation in the Multi-payer Fee Schedule will be open to all school districts and charter schools beginning January 1, 2025.

Teachers tour tech sites to help students make connections for the future

GOLETA, Calif. - Teachers from Carpinteria High School were learning about jobs in technology today with plans to bring back information to students about a career path in the future.

Not all of the jobs of the future require a computer, mathematics or engineering degree. Some can be learned from a starting position within a company and for those working at Curvature with a dual track including college, there's also tuition assistance.

Curvature General Manager Sachi Thompson said she often looks for employees who are the right fit and have the right work ethic plus a willingness to learn. "So, a lot of my guys will start as an entry level role, blowing out equipment on the dock, just getting the dust off of it, working the floor," she said. "Then they graduate up."

On the walk through, the technical manager Justin Hallstrom said to get a job, your background could be building home equipment. "Whether it is for gaming or home usage in general or knowing how to slot a memory stick in or what a CPU does or what a hard drive is."

"The South Coast Chamber of Commerce CEO Kristin Miller said there are many new and growing tech companies on the South Coast. "There's great career opportunities right here at home." The goal is to have the teachers encourage local students to tap into their full potential in the years ahead.

Miller said, "if we can expose them to a wide variety of opportunities including high tech, that's a great way to support our local economy as well as supporting our youth."

Part of the presentation explained to the teachers that they can go back to their students who are 16 and 17 years old and say in the years ahead they can walk through the doors of some of the companies and have a well-paid job even while they are in college.

The tech companies also have a relationship that could help each other with qualified workers or to keep them in the area if there's downsizing. The teachers learned the ongoing need for companies to access a qualified workforce for the future. Thompson said, "I look for people that have a lot of grit and a lot of talent inside and they want to make a difference. They have something to prove, and they are kind of like a clay that we get to mold."

Certificated Personnel Report

Certificated employees are those whose positions require a specific credential issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

The certificated personnel report is generated regularly and includes all actions made regarding employment of certificated employees at SBCEO such as appointments and separations.

Classified Personnel Report

Classified employees are those whose positions do not require a state-issued credential. Since 1975, the Santa Barbara County Education Office has operated a Merit System for the classified service. Merit System law (Education Code § 45240-45320) provides that classified employees are selected, retained and promoted on the basis of merit and fitness, exclusive of discrimination due to actual or perceived race, color, ethnicity, age, religion, political affiliation, marital status, disability, gender, sexual orientation or national origin. The Personnel Commission, composed of three members, is the impartial body authorized by the state to be responsible for implementing and interpreting Merit System rules and adjudicating appeals on those facets of employment within its purview.

The classified personnel report is typically generated monthly and includes all personnel actions affecting classified employees at SBCEO such as appointments, changes to status, and separations.

California *Education Code* Section 1240 requires that we visit schools identified in our county, review information in the areas noted below, and report to you the results of the visits and reviews. It is a pleasure to submit this report on the condition and state of these 18 schools in Santa Barbara County for 2022-23.

The purpose of the visits as specified in California Education Code 1240 were:

1. Determine if students have "sufficient" standards-aligned instructional materials in four core subject areas (English language arts, mathematics, history/social science and science

(including science laboratory equipment in grades 9-12)) and, as appropriate, in world languages and health;

- 2. Determine if there is any facility condition that "poses an emergency or urgent threat to the health or safety of pupils or staff"; and
- 3. Determine if the school has provided accurate data on the annual school accountability report card related to the sufficiency of instructional materials and the safety, cleanliness, and adequacy of school facilities, including "good repair."

The law further requires Santa Barbara County Education Office to:

- 1. Annually monitor and review teacher misassignments and teacher vacancies;
- 2. Receive quarterly reports on complaints filed within the school district concerning insufficient instructional materials, teacher vacancies and misassignments, and emergency or urgent facilities issues under the Uniform Complaint Procedure; and ¹
- 3. Review audit exceptions under expanded authority in the areas of use of instructional materials program funds, teacher misassignments, and information reported on the school accountability report card and determine whether the exceptions are either corrected or an acceptable plan of correction has been developed.

While the areas enumerated in this paragraph are not mandated to be a part of this report to you, they are being included so that you and the citizens of our communities will have a complete understanding of the environment in which Santa Barbara County schools are functioning.

Before proceeding with the report, let me define some basic terms:

- "Sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means each pupil, including English learners, has a standards-aligned textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home.
- A school facility condition that poses an "emergency or urgent threat" is a "condition that poses a threat to the health or safety of pupils or staff while at school." [Note: this definition and quote is drawn from EC 17592.72(c)(1) because it is incorporated by reference in EC 1240(c)(2)(E)(ii).]
- "Good repair" means the school facilities are clean, safe and functional as determined pursuant to the school facility inspection and evaluation instrument developed by the Office of Public School Construction or a local evaluation instrument that meets the same criteria.

¹ Not applicable for charter schools

The findings related to the five areas evaluated (instructional materials, facilities, school accountability report card, teacher vacancies or assignments, and Uniform Complaint Procedures) are summarized below.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Santa Barbara County Education Office Williams Evaluation Team completed the visits between September 30 and October 25, 2022. The principals were organized, and, in most cases, the staff and students had been informed about the purpose of the visit. School principals, as well as others (district representatives, assistant principals, custodians, etc.) accompanied the evaluation team on the visit and were eager to share information about their school. Their cooperation made the visitation process more manageable and allowed the team to accomplish the task quickly with little disruption to students in classrooms. A pre and post briefing was conducted with the principals to review the visitations process, update information, and answer questions.

INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

Twenty-five percent of elementary classrooms (76 of 208) were visited, including at least one class from each grade level and special education, and 20 percent of junior high and high school core courses (168 of 731). Junior high and high school visits included science labs, health, and world language courses, if applicable.

It was determined that sufficient textbooks and instructional materials have been provided for every pupil, including English language learners, for use in class, after class, and to take home. Textbook inventories were provided and verified as evidence of sufficient materials.

Each district provided a listing of standards-aligned State adopted or board-adopted textbooks in the four core areas, and the evaluation team verified that these are the instructional materials that are being used in each class or course.

SCHOOL FACILITIES

The evaluation of the facilities included classrooms, offices, libraries, labs, auditoriums, gyms and locker rooms, stadiums, storage rooms, cafeterias, all restrooms, grounds, ball fields, tracks, bleachers, storage sheds, mechanical equipment rooms, etc. All facilities were found to be in good repair. At sites where construction projects were in progress, every effort was being made to secure the safety of the students. No Emergency Facilities Needs Projects were identified. In most cases, school custodians are responsible for the daily cleaning and some minor repairs. The district offices take an active role in providing repairs and upkeep in a timely manner.

SCHOOL ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT CARD

School districts are required to include data for these topics in the SARCs:

- Sufficient textbooks availability of sufficient standards-aligned textbooks and other instruction materials.
- Facilities Safety, cleanliness, and adequacy of school facilities, including needed maintenance to ensure good repair.
- Teacher Vacancies or Assignments/Misassignments number of teacher vacancies or misassignments.

All schools provided SARCs to SBCEO. The Evaluation Team verified that the data was accurate.

TEACHER VACANCY OR ASSIGNMENT/MISASSIGNMENT

With the passage of AB 1219, teacher credential monitoring is now completed through the California Statewide Assignment Accountability System (CalSAAS) reporting system.

UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

Uniform Complaint Procedures signs (including notice for complaints related to instructional materials, condition of facilities posing an emergency or urgent threat, and teacher vacancies/misassignments) were posted in all classrooms visited and it was verified that the complaint forms are available in the school offices.

All Santa Barbara County districts have submitted quarterly reports indicating that there were no unresolved Williams Legislation complaints.

In conclusion, we find the Santa Barbara County schools we evaluated to be in compliance with the Williams Settlement Legislation. The districts and schools are to be complimented, again, for their cooperation and efforts to comply with and implement these requirements.
