5. Student/Staff Presentations/Recognitions

5.1. Superintendent Boblett and Assistant Superintendent Matt Spade recognized Katie Hale, Teacher at Ponderosa Elementary, who was a finalist for Kentucky Teacher of the Year and was honored in Frankfort at the Kentucky State Capitol Rotunda on September 13.

6. Request to Address Board Chair - Per Board Policy 01.421 and KRS 160.270 (Public Comment)

Please keep in mind the Board uses the public comment period as an opportunity to listen to citizen concerns and comments. The board will not debate issues or enter into a question-and-answer dialogue. Under Board policy, your comments are limited to 3 minutes, the Superintendent will track the time.

7. Dialogue

7.1. ACT Test Results-Jacob Meade, Boyd County High School Assistant Principal Mr. Meade shared with the board that comparison was made between the Sophomore ACT Test results and the Junior ACT Test results. The findings indicated that there was a 1.0 increase in composite scores from a 17.1 to 18.2 as well as an increase in each of the sub-categories. This data will also be used by teachers to assist their students with improving their scores.

7.2. Working Budget - Scott Burchett, District Finance Director

Mr. Burchett provided the board with highlights for the 2024 working budget. Some highlights included the approval of a 4% increase in revenue tax rates to increase General Fund Revenues. He also stressed that since there will be a decrease in SEEK funds due to moving back to ADA after COVID years in calculating SEEK funds. He stated that attendance needed to be pushed since it will be driving SEEK funds for the year. He also stated that renovation of Cannonsburg Elementary and construction of Boyd County Career and Technical Center will be ongoing this year and into the summer. He concluded by sharing with the board that he believes that the district is in good fiscal shape.

7.3. Superintendent Boblett recognized Mr. Dave West, President of Trace Creek Construction, who is overseeing the construction projects for Cannonsburg Elementary and Boyd County Career and Technical Center. Superintendent Boblett asked the board if Mr. West could give an update on the project and the board agree to the request. Mr. West shared with the board that ground has been broken for the Tech Center project and that the demolition of Cannonsburg Elementary was just starting as they prepare to remove the old roof and replace with a new one. He will continue to come each month and report to the board on the progress.

7.4 Superintendent Boblett asked to read a statement relating to questions as to what the district is doing to keep students safe. Mr. Boblett shared the following steps in place for district to ensure that is happening: a Safe Schools Director has been hired whose chief responsibility is to keep students and staff safe; staff are aware of proper reporting procedures in suspected abuse cases; discussions with Ky Center for School Safety Coordinator for training opportunities for staff; cameras in place at BCHS and throughout the district; STOP tipline for anonymous reporting of issues within the district; School Safety Officers placed in every school in the district; and students can report issues to teachers, staff, counselors, dean of students; assistant principals and the principal. He also shared that the person in question is no longer employed with the district.


