2023-2024 First Creek Dress Code

ALL CLOTHING: No exposed skin from collar bones to three inches above the knees and no see-through material. Students should not wear hoods or hats in the building.

1. <u>TOPS:</u>

First Cree Eagle Shirt – purchased at First Creek Middle School <u>* This is required attire*</u>

2. BOTTOMS:

- All pants should be worn at the waistline.
- Shorts, dresses, and skirts should be no higher than 3 inches above the knee.
- No tears, holes, or cuts higher than 3 inches above the knee unless solid leggings are worn underneath.

3. FOOTWEAR:

- Must have toe covering and back/heel straps and soles.
- No flip flops, sandals, slides, slippers, or moccasins.
- No heels taller than 2 inches.

4. ACCESSORIES:

- The following items are not allowed at school:
 - Bandanas, Do-rags, Spikes, and Sunglasses
- o Clothing items can never promote or reference the following:
 - Alcohol, Bigotry, Drugs, Gangs, Racism, Sex, Suicide, Tobacco, Vandalism, Violence

5. <u>PE GEAR:</u>

- \circ Students must wear athletic shoes on PE days.
- Locker rooms will be available. Students are encouraged to bring comfortable clothes to school on the days they have PE. If weather permits, PE will be outside. Please bring a coat.

Dress Code

The purpose of the school dress code is to provide a means of identification and belonging to First Creek Middle School; it helps us better define ourselves as a community. This is also a safety protocol that makes it possible for us to easily identify intruders. Our First Creek dress code is designed to help students focus on learning. It also contributes to our safe and orderly school environment. Students must dress appropriately and according to the guidelines. There will be no modifications to intended style. Students must remain in dress code the entire school day including arrival and departure. Students who do not comply with the First Creek uniform will be asked to make adjustments and/or have a guardian bring the appropriate items. We will have <u>Free Dress Days.</u> Students are required to dress appropriately and according to the guidelines set forth by staff and administration. Questions regarding this attire must be clarified beforehand. * Please notify the office or counselors if you are having difficulty fulfilling the dress code expectations.



2023-2024 First Creek Student Cell Phone Expectations

Maintaining the integrity of the learning environment is the top priority.

- Students will be permitted to have cell phones in their possession throughout the school day.
- Students **MUST** have their cell phones on silent during the school day; *cell phone use shall cause no distraction or disruption.*
- Cell phones will be out of sight during instructional time (inside and outside of classrooms)
- Cell phone charging is not allowed on campus.
- <u>The only exception to the above policies is as follows</u>: cell phones used for instructional purposes will be permitted, with the teacher's explicit permission and supervision.

If a student is using a cell phone during class, the following consequences will apply:

- First few infractions Verbal and/or non-verbal warning
- **Continued Issues** Teacher will reach out to guardians.
- Continues issues after several contacts made to parents by the teacher Teacher will submit a behavior referral. Admin, student, and families will work together to make a plan for success. Phones may be confiscated for the period or the day.

Certain infractions will result in students immediately losing the privilege to carry a cell phone on campus.

Consequences include, but are not limited to, infractions such as:

• Recording fights, drugs/alcohol use, bullying, or recording students and staff without consent.

During times of testing, teachers may request that students remove their cell phone from their possession reducing the possibility of compromised test security


We gratefully honor and acknowledge that we rest on the traditional lands of the Puyallup People where they make their home and speak the Twulshootseed language.

No hall passes the first and last 15 minutes of class.


How to be a Successful Eagle

Bring all materials and supplies to class. This includes the following:


- Laptop, fully charged
