Welcome back to the 2022-2023 school year! While students enjoyed their much-needed summer break, I was thrilled to see that so many students spent time keeping skills fresh by participating in our second Warrior Whiz IXL Summer Challenge! Our top participant answered 6,203 questions during the summer! Incredible!! In total, we had 521 students participate at the level required to receive a t-shirt. A form will be sent home within the next couple of weeks to obtain shirt sizes for each participant. Students that achieved a proficient rating on at least 20 skills will be entered into our prize drawing. We had 100 students eligible at this level! Our larger prizes are being purchased now to align with the number of students that participated at a high level in each grade band. We will draw for our larger prizes at that time and will reach out to parents to arrange pick-up. Thank you to all of our parents and guardians who encouraged this practice over the summer. 



From your Director of Academic Services...

Dear DCSC Families,

Physical and online textbooks provide our teachers with valuable resources as they cover required state standards. All textbooks are reviewed on a six-year cycle for possible adoption. During the 2021-2022 school year, teachers from all grade levels were involved in a process to review the math textbooks we were currently using as compared to other products available. After months of consideration and scrutiny, our adoption committee recommended that we utilize a new textbook, Reveal Math, for mathematics instruction from kindergarten through core math classes at the high school level. Adopting one aligned program makes vertical articulation of the curriculum easier and ensures students have an easier transition from grade to grade. This year, in the first year of use, our mathematics teachers have completed professional development to learn more about the resources available and will continue to work together to revise their curriculum maps as needed. We are excited to provide students with these enhanced materials that will provide the best learning experience possible!



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

STOPIT! REPORTING SYSTEM

Danville Schools has launched STOPIt! This new system replaces the SafeSchools Alert reporting system we have been using in Danville Schools for 3 years. The STOPIt! reporting system can be an anonymous means to report matters of concern such as warning signs, signals, and/or threats; illegal and/or dangerous items and actions; concerns about student self-harm behaviors; bullying and harassment (written, verbal, physical, cyber, exclusion) or illegal activity (weapons, drugs, alcohol, theft, vandalism).



This new system is an upgrade to our previous reporting tool. It allows for two-way, confidential communication between the person reporting a concern and school administrators. It also allows our schools to capture important data about incidents in our school community. Student information is not needed to use STOPIt! The only way personally identifiable information will be accessible is if a person voluntarily includes it within the content of a report or message.

The STOPIt! app has been installed on all district-owned student Chromebooks. Students, parents, and guardians may also install the FREE STOPIt! app on their personal mobile devices. Simply search for the "STOPIt! app" on your smartphone or tablet app store.

Dear DCSC Families.

As the district moves forward with the renovation of facilities, improving student safety is a significant consideration in the design and improvements to our buildings and grounds. When considering school safety, our thoughts may quickly jump to some of the tragic events that have occurred across many communities in the nation. However, school safety covers many aspects beyond this.

Earlier this school year, our DCSC police department sponsored a school safety awareness event which was useful in reflecting on the many layers of safety we have implemented at Danville Community Schools to protect students and staff members. Developmental Group
The developmental group will be comprised of swimmers who are not fully proficient in all strokes, but are able to swim 25 plus yards repetitively. Swimmers in this group focus on improving technique in free-back and putting together aimskick for breastify. Other areas of focus will include wailistanting block shallow dive technique, tigo turn and open turn techniques, breath holding white swimming strokes, underwater kicking in streamline position and use of training aids such as kickboards, pull buoys, fins, and pace clocks. Developmental group is ideal for any intermediate/advanced lesson swimmer who wishes to maintain skills and work on endurance, but chooses to not compete and/or commit to practice time required for competitive team. Developmental group is geared towards preparing swimmers for competition level swimming. Development group meets 2 times weekly for 60 minutes each.

- Ability to swim 25 yards, Comfortable with holding breath underwater for 10 seconds while swimming.
 Basic understanding of free/back (can perform basic differentiation between each stroke)

The entry level competitive club team age group. Swimmers focus on refining stroke techniques freestyle, backstroke and intro breaststroke and butterfly will be geared towards preparing swimmers for higher levels of competitive swimming with further focus on starts, turns, breathing patterns, and use of pace clocks. Some interval training will be introduced at this level. Swimmers in this group practice 2 times weekly for 60 minutes each. Participation in team meets is strongly encouragely encourage.

. Ability to swim 50 yards with a minimal stop at the wall

Flames

Our second level competition age group focuses on developing stroke techniques, racing starts and turns. Stroke instruction will be broken down into segments for the swimmer to focus on execution. Swimmers will focus on methods to build endurance. Swimmers in this group should work to proficiency in any stroke which is not adequate for legal swimming in competition. Flames practice 3 days per week for 80 minutes each. Team meet participation is required.

- Ability to swim 100 yards without stopping in repetitive sets
 Ability to use pace clock appropriately and without guidance
- · Ability to perform each stroke nearing "legal" level of proficiency
- Comfortable executing starts/turns for each stroke
 Ability to self-guide through sets without full reliance on coaches
- · Endurance to practice for 90 minutes at a time


THANK YOU, MR. KALLAS!

- SAT, an accountability measure for students in grade 11
- Advanced Placement Exams, a measure of content mastery in each AP course
- NWEA, a K-2 assessment for mathematics growth and, in some instances, an assessment for grades 3-12

The results from these assessments provide accountability to our communities and inform our goal-setting for the year ahead. We pride ourselves on achieving at the top of the state year after year but also on our staff's willingness to never stop working hard to get better. Developmental Group
The developmental group will be comprised of swimmers who are not fully proficient in all strokes, but are able to swim 25 plus yards repetitively. Swimmers in this group focus on improving technique in free/back and putting together aministick for breastifly. Other areas of focus will include walkistaring block shallow dive technique, tijo turn and open turn techniques, breath holding white swimming strokes, underwater kicking in streamline position and use of training aids such as kickboards, pull buoys, fins, and pace clocks. Developmental group is ideal for any intermediate/advanced lesson swimmer who wishes to maintain skills and work on endurance, but chooses to not compete and/or commit to practice time required for competitive team. Developmental group is geared towards preparing swimmers for competition level swimming. Development group meets 2 times weekly for 60 minutes each.

- Ability to swim 25 yards, Comfortable with holding breath underwater for 10 seconds while swimming.
- . Basic understanding of free/back (can perform basic differentiation between each stroke)

Sparks

The entry level competitive club team age group. Swimmers focus on refining stroke techniques freestyle, backstroke and intro breaststroke and butlerfly will be geared towards preparing swimmers for higher levels of competitive swimming with further focus on starts, turns, breathing patterns, and use of pace clocks. Some interval training will be introduced at this level. Swimmers in this group practice 2 times weekly for 60 minutes each. Participation in team meets is strongly encouraged.

Ability to swim 50 yards with a minimal stop at the wall

Flames

Our second level competition age group focuses on developing stroke techniques, racing starts and turns. Stroke instruction will be broken down into segments for the swimmers to focus on execution. Swimmers will focus on methods to build endurance. Swimmers in this group should work to proficiency in any stroke which is not adequate for legal swimming in competition. Flames practice 3 days per week for 60 minutes each. Team meet participation is required.

- Ability to swim 100 yards without stopping in repetitive sets
 Ability to use pace clock appropriately and without guidance
- Ability to perform each stroke nearing "legal" level of proficiency.
- Comfortable executing starts/furns for each stroke
 Ability to self-guide through sets without full reliance on coaches
- · Endurance to practice for 90 minutes at a time.

Evaluation Night is Thursday March 16th at 6pm at Danville High School Pool. Use Door #17.
