STUDENT INTERNET SAFETY...

Our *Lightspeed Safety Check* and the *Relay Parent Report* are back our content filter vendor Lightspeed! These are designed to help keep your students safe while using their Chromebook on campus or away from school. These solutions fall under the *Lightspeed Protect* lineup and give us powerful new tools to help keep all students safe.



Lightspeed Safety Check is a system designed to analyze student search behavior and take note of targeted keywords which then automatically notifies district administrators in the event risky behavior is noticed. If this alert goes off our building administrators are notified by email and will reach out to listed parent/guardians to make sure they're aware of this risky situation.

Relay Parent Report is a system designed to notify parents on a weekly basis of all internet activity on individual student Chromebooks. This report will be emailed to parents listed in Infinite Campus over the weekend and give some basic internet activity stats for that week. There is data on how much they used their device before, during and after school as well as information on what websites they went to and any websites they were prevented from going to due to our content filtering blocked that request.



A LETTER FROM OUR CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER...

Dear parents, guardians and community members,

In the next couple of months, the community will begin to see renovation work at North Elementary School. The project includes a variety of important updates to support our school corporation's youngest students and to extend the useful life of the building. North Elementary was built in 1963 and last renovated in 1998. The project's scope is wide and will touch every room in the building. The project work includes:

- LED lighting installation
- Window replacements
- Restroom improvements
- · Carpet and flooring upgrades
- A multipurpose group learning and meeting room
- · Secure vestibule and entrance near the main office
- New playground equipment

The school corporation sold first mortgage bonds at a net interest rate of 0.4% to finance the project. The bonds will be repaid in 2021 and 2022 without raising debt service taxes above the rate taxpayers are paying in 2020. We are excited about this project and look forward to many more years educating our youngest students in a renovated North Elementary School.

• SPAM ALERT...

We are seeing a drastic increase in the number of spam accounts that are trying to take advantage of our fans by attempting to capitalize on our live streams for our football games each week.

Red flags to look for are highlighted in yellow on the attached screenshot: WHO is hosting the event? WHAT is the link? When something doesn't seem quite right, it probably isn't.

They are tagging us in the events so our location and official page does show up until the page is reported and taken down. Fans should only follow links sent out by one of DCSC's or DCHS's official social media accounts.

• HOMECOMING 2020...

As of September 29, 2020, the DCHS Homecoming Parade and Game are scheduled to take place. Any changes or cancellations will be announced on the DCSC Facebook and Twitter pages, and on the district website.

•FREE MEALS EXTENDED...

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recently announced an extension of the nationwide waiver for the School Nutrition Program and will be continuing to provide FREE breakfast and lunch meals for all Danville Community School Corporation students until June 30, 2021, <u>OR until federal funds are depleted, whichever comes first.</u>



As a reminder, DCSC students can receive one free breakfast and one free lunch per day. This program applies to reimbursable meals only. All a la carte sale pricing will remain the same. A reimbursable meal includes choices from five food groups including grains, protein, milk, fruit and vegetables. A student must select a minimum of three of these and must include a fruit or vegetable. Free/reduced meal applications must still be approved to receive free textbooks.

Our DCSC Online students are also eligible for free meals! Please contact our Director of Food Services Mrs. Stephanie Stuemke at sstuemke@danville.k12.in.us or 317-745-0366 to sign up. Meal packages are distributed once a week from South Elementary on Monday mornings at 10:30 a.m. at Door 3.




·December 2020...

·Student Tutoring·



For the past 10 years, students from Danville Community High School have been making important connections with students at our other three schools through the DCSC Student Tutoring Program. Despite the challenges with COVID-19, the program continued this year thanks to technology.

Mrs. Schaffter, our DCHS librarian and the program leader, said that high school tutors have been placed at North and South Elementary Schools as well as Danville Community Middle School. Tutoring assignments are made by both tutors' grade-level preferences and our teachers' requests for tutors.



"The number of students participating varies annually by students' interests and schedules as well as teachers' schedules," Mrs. Schaffter explained. "Last August for the in-person tutoring course, we had 18 students enrolled. This August for virtual tutoring we had nine."

Most DCHS students that participate in the program do so during their school day, with the program counting as a year long elective course. Some students volunteer their time and participate outside of their school day. If they have more time in their schedules, student also have the option to apply for the Warrior Pride Internship to work a couple of periods a day with our cooperation teachers/classrooms.

"I have had tutors in the past enroll in the tutoring program their junior year and the internship their senior year. I also have had students enroll in the tutoring course and the internship the same semester to allow for more experience working with teachers and classes," Mrs. Schaffter added.

The program is a great way for students interested in pursuing education to get early experience and determine if it is the best path for them.

DCHS Senior David Pettet said that he initially wanted to go into teaching, but through this program and his time working in our PACE before and after school program, he has learned that he might be pulled more toward victim advocacy and working with children in the court system.

"I am learning so much and I am grateful for that," he said. "I learned how to be more adaptable and to have a fluid plan about how my things are going to go. It is definitely the best class I signed up for this year and it will show you how you interact with humans when circumstances get strenuous."

Switching to virtual tutoring this year has also taught David a few lessons. He said it has been great to learn how to adapt and maneuver being a tutor when he can't be there to assert his presence and read how the kids are feeling.

Mrs. Schaffter said that the program has been a success for the last decade thanks to the participation, individual efforts, and positive impact our North, South and DCMS teachers have on Danville children. The experience is rewarding for all of the students involved and they leave with more than just knowledge for their future careers, she added.

"Our student tutors get the joyful experience, that we teachers have, of building relationships and seeing kids succeed!"

David agreed and said, "I love seeing the children every day. Starting my day doing something I love makes going through the day a lot easier."

"Miss Crosby has incorporated topics covering soil and water conservation, forestry, natural resources and agricultural literacy into her middle school agriculture curriculum. She has created a unique, one of a kind middle school agriculture curriculum at the fifth through eighth



grade level. Miss Crosby also coaches Danville FFA teams in Horticulture, Entomology, Floriculture, Dairy and Leadership. She also serves as the Outdoor Lab Coordinator for Danville Community Schools. Under Miss Crosby's direction, the outdoor lab has been revitalized and made available for all Danville teachers to utilize. She also added raised garden beds to the outdoor lab and grows vegetables in the beds to donate to local food pantries."

• The Art of Connection •



When adults are faced with the unknown or the uncertain, we tend to be fearful or anxious. Our North Elementary Warriors react the same way and our staff has been working hard to help them adjust to the many changes COVID-19 has brought to their daily life.

"Our students are very much aware of the tangible impact the pandemic has had on our learning environment," North Art Teacher and 2020 Indiana Teacher of the Year Miss Katie Pourcho said. "Plexiglass, masks, smelly hand sanitizer, and mandatory small groups can all be clearly observed by our youngest students. While the effects of the pandemic are easily understood by students, the 'why' is a little harder to define to an age group whose brains are still developing abstract reasoning."

To help them better understand, her kindergarten students have been learning about artists that create medical illustrations. Miss Pourcho showed them microscopic photos and even brought microscopes into her art room to have her students view objects like construction paper or fly wings. Seeing visuals of both the virus under the microscope and full color medical illustrations provide concrete connections for our students. This visual connection also decreases fear of what seems invisible, unknown, and scary.

Miss Pourcho, of course, takes this lesson even further and ties it in with their social emotional learning.

"Just as the images of the virus decrease uncertainty, putting a face on negative emotions can help our youngest students identify and mentally process their feelings," she said.

Her students were asked to choose an emotion like sadness, anger or disgust, and use the colors, shapes, and lines they believed best described that feeling.

"Like Alissa Eckert, who digitally rendered Corona Virus to assist in educating the public, KID-artists are creating a collage to help identify and explain an emotion that may otherwise seem abstract or unknown," Miss Pourcho explained. "Unlike Ms. Eckert's medical illustrations which are based on

collected microscopic images and data, KID-artists are using their exceptional imaginations and experiences."

Including microscopes in art class may seem unusual at first. But in Miss Pourcho's world, everything is connected (and magical.)

"No educational subject should exist in a vacuum," she said. "Every core area, whether it be mathematics or dance, is interconnected. Likewise, creative professionals - whether they be cooks, physicists, or architects -practice innovative solutions when they fuse both logical and imaginative forms of thought."

Miss Pourcho's art classroom is a launch point for this fusion practice. In the North Elementary Art Studio, KID-artists explore, wonder, and express. Miss Pourcho said they do this in a variety of ways.

"We look at 'creatives' in history, we experience the world through our senses, and we investigate new ideas," she said. "This lesson featuring the microscope station is a prime example. Pre-kindergarteners and kindergarteners studied the work of biologist Robert Hooke and medical illustrator Alissa Eckert.

Both 'creatives' illustrated what they observed to teach people about the microscopic world around them."

•Hero Squad•



Danville Community Middle School students have been joining forces with The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS) for several years to raise funds for blood cancer research and patient support services. Previously named Pennies for Patients, the fundraiser was revamped this year and is now known as the Hero Squad Program. Our Warriors join thousands of schools across the country to take on the mission of ending cancer once and for all!

DCMS 7th/8th Grade Social Studies Teacher Mr. Jeffries runs the program as our National Junior Honors Society (NJHS) adviser, but he said our NJHS students are the ones that take the lead on the fundraiser each year.

"They hang up the signs, create posters, distribute flyers and collection bags. They collect the donations and count every penny! It's quite the logistical task really," Mr. Jeffries said. "The secondary tasks here are to represent our chapter in other classrooms, answer questions from student groups, and ultimately advertise for future members."

Due to COVID-19, the program focused on a virtual donation page and shifted away from collecting as many physical donations this year. The fundraiser inspires some friendly competition between middle school GOAL classes (similar to homeroom classes) and runs for about four weeks. This year, the GOAL class that collects the most receives a celebratory pizza party.

Participating students gain so much more than a possible pizza party, however. The program provides them with an opportunity to feel a part of something bigger than themselves and to do some good for others.

"It's so easy to get held up in our own little bubbles. With NJHS there is a focus on community, and a community looks for ways to help others," Mr. Jeffries explained. "It speaks volumes of one's character to selflessly give up money for others. Empathy is a part of our Warrior Way and this fundraiser helps bolster that quality in each and every student."

Students like Gabby Ivie, an eighth-grader at DCMS and president of NJHS.

Gabby has participated in the fundraiser before and said it inspires her to get involved in other ways because of all the people it helps.

"It is very important to support the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society because many people have developed these cancers, and some don't have the money for the treatments needed to fight those cancers off," Gabby said. "So, with the support of others, they can afford those treatments that are necessary. Even the smallest acts can help."

Mr. Jeffries said he hopes all DCMS students walk away from the fundraiser with a feeling of being a part of something greater.

"I hope they can see that regardless of differences, of pandemics, and of other negative aspects, there is a far greater sense of people wanting to help others," he added. "I hope they carry that with them as they grow and continue to look for opportunities to help their fellow Human Beings."

At the time this newsletter was published, the DCMS Hero Squad had raised \$1,703 to help fight cancer - so far!



•A letter from our Superintendent...

Dear parents, guardians and community members,

As we round out National Public Schools Week this week of February 22-26, 2021, please take a moment to reflect upon the obligations and value that public schools bring to our community. Public schools accept and educate all students that enter their doors. In fact, 90% of all Indiana students attend public schools, while only about 10% attend charter or private schools. Public schools provide academic training, civics education, emotional support, and provide all state and federally required supports to students and families.

Knowing this, you may find it ironic to know that, as currently proposed, House bill 1005 in the Indiana legislature would allocate only approximately 62% of new state dollars targeted for K-12 education to traditional public schools while reserving 38% of these same funds for charter and private schools. These large increases for charter and private schools would appear as large increases in funding per student for charter school students and large voucher tax credits for private school students. Voucher eligibility would be increased to three times the federal poverty limit at which a family of five earning over \$170,000 annually would be eligible for a voucher. At the same time, traditional public schools struggle to keep pace with other states in the effort to increase teacher pay.

The vast majority of people in our community attended public schools, or have children and grandchildren attending our public schools now. Please support our public school students by supporting equitable increases in funding for public schools to ensure the future for our children. Please also take a moment to thank our public school educators for the dedicated service they provide for our community.





•A LETTER FROM OUR CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER...

Dear parents, guardians and community members,

In the coming days, property taxpayers will receive their tax bill from the Hendricks County Treasurer's office. I would like to highlight how DCSC fits into your 2021 tax statement.

The overall tax rate paid by taxpayers is a combination of each overlapping taxing unit's tax rate. In the Town of Danville, for instance, Hendricks County, the Town of Danville, DCSC, and Danville Public Library levy property taxes. Taxpayers in each of DCSC's three taxing districts (Town of Danville, Center Township outside of Danville, and Marion Township) pay the same tax rate for the school system, but pay different overall rates, depending upon the tax rates set by overlapping taxing units in the district.

DCSC's 2021 property tax rate is \$1.3372 per \$100 of taxable assessed value. In 2020 and 2019, it was \$1.3689 and \$1.3628, respectively. The lower tax rate this year is attributable to three causes:

- 1. The decision by the DCSC school board to set tax rates at or below the 2020 level.
- 2. Increased assessed values throughout the community.
- 3. Favorable first mortgage bond terms on the North Elementary renovation project's two year payback.





•REAL LIFE LESSONS•



You may not use everything you learn in high school as an adult, but one useful lesson that will always be important is how to manage a budget. Junior and senior students in Mr.

Neilson's economics class at Danville Community High School have been immersed in a real life lesson on how to live on their own and be financially secure.

"I created this assignment many years ago as a culminating activity for the students to get a taste of what life is like on their own," Mr. Neilson said. "I do this project every semester in economics and most of the students admit (painfully) that it is tough to live on your own with just a high school diploma and minimal skills. Most of the students comment that they need either more training, skills, licenses, and education."

Students conduct research to find real jobs and how much they pay, vehicle and vehicle insurance costs, rent and utility costs, phone and internet costs, as well as food, clothing, entertainment and other living expenses. Each budget area has to be legitimate and students show their sources for the information.

"My goal is to get the students to think critically about life choices and how to survive after high school, plus just how expensive it is to live," Mr. Neilson explained. "I am hoping they gain an appreciation for the costs of living and also what parents sacrifice so that students can have nice clothes, a roof over their head, vehicles to drive, and food on the table."

In class, students were checking websites for rates and estimates. Some even called local insurance agents and checked house listings. Once all of this information is collected, students create a presentation of their findings.

All of the ideas, concepts, skills and challenges they have been studying in class all year come down to this project. But the lesson, Mr. Neilson said, is about much more than meeting state education standards.

"The most valuable lesson for the students on this project is the awareness that comes with having to make life choices that many of my students don't have to worry about until after graduation, either high school or college."










•Child Abuse Recognition and Prevention...

April is <u>National Child Abuse Prevention Month</u>. It recognizes the importance of families and communities working together to strengthen families to prevent child abuse and neglect. Through this collaboration, prevention services and supports help protect children and produce thriving families.

At least 1 in 7 children have experienced child abuse and/or neglect in the past year, and this is likely an underestimate. In 2019, 1,840 children died of abuse and neglect in the United States. The total lifetime economic burden associated with child abuse and neglect is over \$400 billion a year; this rivals the cost of other high-profile public health problems, such as stroke and Type II diabetes. It occurs in all cultures, countries and economic classes.

Our friends at Hendricks Regional Health discuss child abuse recognition and prevention in this month's <u>Pediatric Unit</u> newsletter.







•SUMMER SAFETY REQUIREMENTS...

As of May 27th, 2021, there have not been any updates from state or local officials on summer safety requirements. We are told, however, that an update will be coming in June. <u>Until we receive updated information, face masks and social distancing will continue to be required on all school property throughout the summer per Governor Holcomb's Executive Order 21-09.</u>

These requirements apply to all on-campus summer activities including graduation, summer meal distribution, summer school, all athletics, PACE, summer camps, etc. The guidelines

•SUMMER MEAL PROGRAM...

The Danville Community School Corporation Food Service Department will be distributing **FREE** summer meals again on **Mondays and Wednesdays** to any child age 18 or younger. Bulk meal distribution will begin on *Wednesday, June 2nd,* from *11 a.m. to 1 p.m.* behind the high school. Meals will be served drive-thru style as a grab-and-go distribution. This summer, households will receive meals for all seven days of the week over the course of the Monday and Wednesday distribution. **Please note that meals will NOT be distributed on July 5th.**



Please see the following guidelines to help our schools stay in compliance with USDA regulations:


- Children ages 18 and younger may participate in the summer feeding program and DO NOT need to be a student at Danville schools.
- Only parents/guardians may pick up meals for their children. If parents are not able to
 pick up meals, they may provide a signed note stating that they give permission to
 another person to pick up meals. We will keep the note on file and a new note is not
 necessary each time for pickup.
- Parents whose children are participating in our summer PACE program, summer Little
 Warrior Learning Center program, or our local Hendricks County Head Start summer
 program SHOULD NOT participate in the bulk meal pick up since they are receiving free
 daily meals while attending these programs. Only two meals per student per day are
 allowed from any federal child nutrition program.

Families should continue to enter from the main entrance at Warrior Way off of U.S. 36 and proceed towards the stadium to the back of the building. Please follow the directional cones, and continue behind the building to pull up alongside the loading dock attached to the building on your left. Once you receive your packages, you will turn around and exit the same drive as it does not connect to Mackey Road. The direction of traffic will move from the left to allow for driver side pick-up and prevent traffic lanes from crossing. Please be mindful and do not block the south drive entering from Lincoln Street between the stadium and the practice field.


