ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Class Schedule: The school calendar is divided into two semesters. We use a block schedule and students can take up to 7 classes in a semester. A 0.5 credit is earned per semester for each class.

Rank and Grade Point Calculation: *We are a non-ranking school district.* Cumulative GPA is based on grades earned in years 9-12. All courses for which the student receives a grade are included in a student's cumulative GPA. GPA is based on a 4.0 scale with an "A" worth 4 points. For Weighted Grade (WG) courses, an "A" is worth 5 points. Weighted Grade courses include all AP level courses and any course denoted by "WG".

Advanced Placement: Lafayette offers 25 courses through the College Board Advanced Placement program. There is no restriction to the number of AP courses a student can take, however there are prerequisites that must be met before enrolling in an AP course.

Advanced/College Credit: Certain courses offered may be taken for college credit. College credit is awarded through the University of Missouri - St. Louis.

Dual Enrollment: Eligible and approved students may take college-level courses through local community colleges and universities during the regular school day. These courses will typically not appear on the high school transcript since they do not usually apply to a student's high school graduation requirements.

Early College Partnership (ECP): ECP is a two-year, full immersion, dual enrollment partnership between the Rockwood School District and St. Louis Community College. Students will obtain an associate degree while fulfilling their high school graduation requirements. Students apply to this program as sophomores, with only 30 students being offered acceptance district-wide.

South Tech: South Technical High School provides students with career and technical education (CTE) that prepares them for continuing education and the workforce. Students participating in a South Tech program do so during their junior and senior years and attend South Tech for half of the school day.

Spark!: Spark! provides high school students in the Rockwood School District with dynamic, immersion-based student learning experiences through collaboration with business and community partnerships

Project Interface: Project Interface is an unpaid summer internship opportunity that places students in a career area of their interest. The program is offered to qualified Rockwood students the summer leading into their senior year of high school.

COVID-19 Update

2019-2020 School Year- On March 23rd, 2020, the Rockwood School District began the Alternative Learning Plan (virtual instruction), which ran until the end of the school year. The District adopted a Hold Harmless policy, which meant that student's grades could improve, but would not be lowered from where they were as of March 12, 2020 (the last day before Spring Break). In addition, final exams were canceled.

2020-2021 School Year- The Rockwood School District began the 2020-2021 school year on August 24th in a virtual setting and resumed in-person learning on Nov 12, 2020. The first semester, classes were split into quarters, with 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 7th hour classes occurring during 1st Quarter (Aug. 24 – Oct. 23) and 2nd, 4th, and 6th hour classes occurring during 2nd Quarter (Oct. 27 - Jan 14th). Some students continued with virtual learning synchronously via Zoom throughout the school year.

2021-2022 School Year- Most students returned to in-person traditional learning. Virtual learning was provided through Rockwood curriculum and supplemented with Launch and other online platforms.
