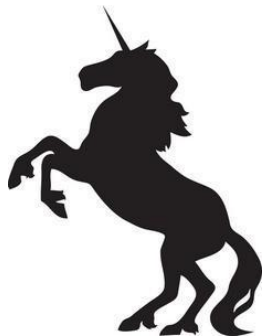
- Succeed in regular programs

Educational Opportunities: There are multiple educational opportunities provided in order to help children reach their maximum level of academic achievement. These opportunities vary based upon student needs.

Attendance Incentives: students are recognized for attending school

Effective Behavior Systems: Our campus-wide common expectations are Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be Responsible. Students are taught what this looks like at school.

Family Events: multiple events to allow families to interact with one another such as student performances and literacy nights.

Inclusion: As determined by an ARD committee, identified students are able to remain in their classrooms with grade level peers while being provided instructional support

Gardening: students participate in a gardening and health program, caring for the garden during the school day

Head Start: partnership with Head Start to provide support to Head Start students and families.

High Quality Curriculum: Teachers use a variety of resources to instruct students following Texas' Pre-Kindergarten Guidelines. This includes resources from Scholastic, Heggerty, Foundations, Estrellitas, and Ready Set Math.

Library Book Fair: at least twice a year families have the opportunity to purchase literacy materials

Special Areas: students participate in library, music, PE, technology, discovery lab, motor lab, courtyard and IDEA Lab.

Parent Conferences: communication between the classroom and home is held in November and as needed throughout the school year

PTA: parents and teachers work together to ensure student success is ongoing. All parents and teachers are encouraged to join and participate.

Special Education: identified students can receive the support they need in order to be successful

Speech Program: identified students can receive speech therapy during the school day.

Technology: students participate in our 1:1 iPad initiative and become familiar with iPads and other relevant technology.

Volunteer Opportunities: The school will provide multiple opportunities for parents and families to be involved on campus.
