In the first phase of the plan development, we held focus groups with staff, students, parents and community members. We accumulated 70 hours worth of feedback from approximately 450 students, parents, staff and community members ages 8-80+ via our Superintendent Entry Plan meetings.

The information shaped our January strategic planning survey, which resulted in over 1,000 responses across constituent groups.

Priorities emerged related to student growth and achievement, social and emotional health and well-being, and recruitment and retention of staff. Our narrowed focus on the Fremont community's priorities is driving our efforts forward, with the goal of taking Fremont School District 79 to the next level. Our goals will be accompanied by a renewed vision and district branding. This collective effort is inspiring our community, anchored by ongoing communication and fiscal responsibility.

We plan to share the new strategic plan in fall 2023. Thanks to all those who have contributed along the way, this plan will be the outcome of tremendous community collaboration.

Fremont staff have fully embraced this year's District theme of "Better Together" through continual teamwork and collaboration with colleagues, students and families. It all adds up to an amazing EDUCATIONAL SCIENCE ROOM RENOVATIONS culture!

ONGOING FACILITY MAINTENANCE

The District continues to address crucial Health/Life Safety issues and maintenance needs to maintain modern and efficient school facilities. Planned improvements include:

- Educational science room renovations
- Safety upgrades such as playground equipment replacements
- Maintenance such as tuckpointing and pavement resurfacing
- Security upgrades such as installing entrance intercoms and cameras, safety bollards and updated door locks

Capital improvement plans are evaluated on an annual basis and projects are selected based on identified needs and priorities. These large scale projects are funded through the operating budget and new development impact fees.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Did you know? Fremont School District 79 has the second-lowest tax rate among area elementary districts.

What this means to taxpayers— Fremont School District 79 values fiscal responsibility while holding high standards for student performance.

Did you know? In December 2022, the Fremont School District 79 School Board approved a 3-year tax abatement in the debt service fund.

What this means to taxpayers— The District is reducing taxes in the debt service by approximately \$700,000 over the next three years.

Did you know? Fremont School District 79 is one of the 10% of school districts in the nation rated Aa1 or higher from Moody's Investment Service.

What this means to taxpayers— These ratings allow the District to receive better interest rates on bonds, saving taxpayers when borrowing may be needed.

Did you know? Fremont School District 79 received \$1.3M in federal funds to respond to pandemicimpacted learning.


What this means to taxpayers— Federal funds were strategically used to improve educational programming, such as kindergarten and reading support, to boost student performance.





Our Fiscal Year 2022 Illinois State Board of Education **financial rating was a 4.0, the highest designation a school can receive.** The rating is based on fund balance/revenue ratio, expenditure/revenue ratio, cash on hand, short-term debt and long-term debt. Due to responsible fiscal management, the District has continued to maintain a 4.0 designation.

FINANCIAL RECOGNITION



Meritorious Budget Award—Fremont is **one of only 15 districts in the state to be recognized for excellence in budget presentation.** The District has earned the honor 10 consecutive years.



Financial Recognition Award—The District has **earned the highest financial distinction from the State of Illinois** with the Financial Recognition Award, which the District has received every year since the state started the program in 2003.

FREMONT AT THE FOREFRONT

Post-pandemic student growth data demonstrated a rebound. At the conclusion of their Fremont experience, our eighth-graders achieve at top national levels. Fall 2022 data showed our eighth-graders achieving at the national 85th percentile for reading and at the 87th percentile for math. 2023 LAKE REGION PRINCIPAL OF THE LET

All Fremont schools earned a STEFAN LADENOL designation status of either "Commendable" or "Exemplary" for 2022 as announced by the Illinois State Board of Education.

The Illinois Principals Association Lake Region **Principal of the Year** was awarded to Krista Winkelman (Fremont Middle School) and Stefan Ladenburger (Fremont Elementary and Intermediate Schools), based on their positive impact and strong leadership.

Fremont's School Board was one of just 33 in the entire state to earn recognition for being engaged in activities that lead to excellence in local school governance in support of quality public education.

Fremont Middle School science teacher Megan Temple was named a recipient of the 2023 Those Who Excel Award of Meritorious Service as presented by the Illinois State Board of Education.

Beginning in the 2023-2024 academic year, full-day kindergarten in Fremont will be free for all students. By eliminating tuition, all students are able to benefit academically, socially and emotionally.
